Plans Made For Student Activity Building

Monday, April 18, 1988 was a day that marked the beginning of something new here on campus. A groundbreaking ecremony was held on this day for a new Student Activity Building.

The construction of the new building was approved by Wesleyan's Board of Trustees at its February 19 meeting following several months of research and discussion by the board's Student Life Committee, Student Government Association members, and members of the administration.

The building is supposed to be a 7000 square foot structure divided into a large multi purpose room, eleven offices, a conference room, recreation room, TV room, and a kitchen.

Among those participating in the groundbreaking ceremony were Wesleyan President Dr. Leslie H. Garner Jr., Rocky Mount Mayor Frederick W. Turnage, Wesleyan trustees John Ferebee and Reese Bailey, Dean of Student Life Steve Cohen, Assistant Dean of Student Life Pamela Derrick, Director of Housing Tina DeLaine, Director of Student Activities Anthony Rice, Campus Minister Dr. Carleton McKita.













Dr. Leslie H. Garner Jr. is the third President of North Carolina Wesleyan College. His inauguration on April 6th, capped two days of celebration and discussion of the future development of Eastern North Carolina, with a number of state and business leaders participating.

In his Inaugural address he pledged the college's resources to prepare Eastern North Carolina for a prosperous future and to preserve the region's native culture. "We are in the midst of the most profound economic transition of this century," Garner said, "Yet all of us should realize that change can be positive. We can still hope for expanded economic opportunity for our citizens, and we still dream of the day when our cultural diversity can be a cause for celebration . . ."

About 1,000 guests and delegates from other colleges attended the event, which was held on the front lawn of the Braswell Administration Building on the Wesleyan campus. Judge Phil Carlton, chairman of Wesleyan's Board of Trustees, presided over the inauguration ceremony.

Participating in the symposium were keynote speaker D. Calloway, chairman and CEO of Pepsico, Inc., former N.C. Governor James B. Hunt, Jr., and William C. Friday, president emeritus of the UNC system and President of the William R. Kenan Jr. Fund.

On April 5th, about 1,000 people attended a musical revue celebrating the history of the college. This event was performed by alumni, students, and members of the Rocky Mount community. The inaugural events reaffirmed the college's commitment to its educational mission and larger role in the community and region.




















Dr. Finney Named Jefferson-Pilot Professor of the Year

Dr. Kenneth V. Finney, chairman and associate professor of history at North Carolina Wesleyan College, has been named the Jefferson-Pilot Professor for 1988.

At a reception honoring Finney, Wesleyan President Dr. Leslie H. Garner Jr. said, "This award is well-deserved. Ken has proven himself as a teacher, a scholar, and a colleague who is vitally interested in promoting the welfare of this institution. The Jefferson-Pilot Professorship was created to recognize those special attributes.

As part of the Professorship, Finney will receive a grant and a personal computer, with appropriate software, provided by the college.

Finney joined the Wesleyan faculty in 1973. He is a specialist in Latin American history and much of his scholarly work combines his interest in Latin America and economic and technological development.

The Jefferson-Pilot Professorship is an endowed program made possible by the Jefferson-Pilot Corp. The Professorship at Wesleyan was established in 1982. Criteria for the appointment include teaching excellence, scholarship, and commitment to Wesleyan.
























































It all started last year with a phone call on Nov. 1, 1986 and a commitment on Nov. 2.

A phone call from head coach Tony Ferrell at 9 p.m. to Kenny Bulkin's room saying the 1986 North Carolina Wesleyan Men's Soccer Team would not be getting a bid to participate in the Division III National Tournament led to a commitment the next day by 19 male Wesleyan student/athletes to win the Dixie Conference, get an automatic bid into the National Tournament, and not sit by the telephone on Nov. 1, 1987.

Thus began the most successful season of men's soccer history at North Carolina Wesleyan College. The 1987 Battling Bishop soccer team won four tournaments; had the team's best ever record at 17-2-2; had the team's highest rankings ever, third in Division III nationally and first in the South; scored the most goals in a season, with 76; hosted the first round of the Southern Regionals in the NCAA National Soccer Tournament; and won the 1987 Dixie Conference championship.

Leslie Holland Garner, Jr., the third President of North Carolina Wesleyan College, is a native of Greenville and a graduate of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He holds a master's degree and Ph.D. in public policy from Harvard University.

After graduate school, Dr. Garner spent two and a half years in Vienna as the Special Assistant to the Director of the International Institute of Applied Systems Analysis. Returning to North Carolina he joined the faculty at UNC-Chapel Hill where he was Foundation Director of the Government Executives Institute, a program for senior state government officials. He developed a program in "Managing the Arts" and was co-director of the University Management Development Program and director of the Young Executives Institute.

Dr. Garner sees the mission of the liberal arts as empowering individuals and affirming community through learning. He believes that at no time has this mission been as important as it is today. The transition of the world into a global economy demands knowledge, broad cultural awareness and creativity to ensure the economic survival of individuals and communities. Dr. Garner believes that the College must position itself to respond to these challenges.

Dr. Garner and his wife, Katrina, who was a founding partner of the Catering Company of Chapel Hill, have two sons, Brantley, age 4 and William, age 2.



SPECIAL NOTE:

The 1987-88 Dissenter has been a long time coming. For reasons still unclear, some 5 pages were found to be missing over the summer of 1988. Beginning that fall, a posta tracer was put on the missing pages. Phone calls were made to the previous adviso Nothing turned up. Determining exactly what was missing became a crucial factor, an with few remaining Dissenter staff members at Wesleyan, a tough one. The only concret determination that could be made was that the student photographs were missing. The photographer was contacted and proofs re-ordered. Meanwhile, hopes for the 1988-8 Dissenter were dim. A lack of interest in producing the book coupled with the burden of reproducing the previous year's book, proved to be too much. After a vote of the SGA the 1988-89 contract with Delmar was breeched. The cost of materials supplied an services rendered was absorbed by the SGA. Still this book needed to be reproduced After working with five Delmar field representatives, I was finally able to finish phot layouts. At this writing some 24 pages are still missing. I do not know if this book will ever be produced, but I can say great effort was taken to deliver this book to the Wesleyan students.

The 1987-88 Dissenter was paid for by student fees, and every student enrolled durin that academic year has the right to a copy. Regardless of whether or not a book is eve produced, all the money set aside has been used in trying to put forth this book. N refunds will be available.

By a vote of the student body in the fall of 1988, the cost of the 1988-89 Dissenter, as wel as future books, would be paid by each student on a per copy basis — not as a part of an activity fee. All the money that had been set aside for the 88/89 book at that time wa rebudgeted through the SGA for activities.
