President's Message

A Message from the President . . .

The 1992-93 academic year was an exceptional year for North Carolina Wesleyan College. The College experienced growth in its full-time, adult degree, and public service programs during the year. At year end, we were within two million dollars of completing the most significant campaign in our history, a campaign that will help us fulfill a 30-year dream to construct an auditorium and fine arts center.

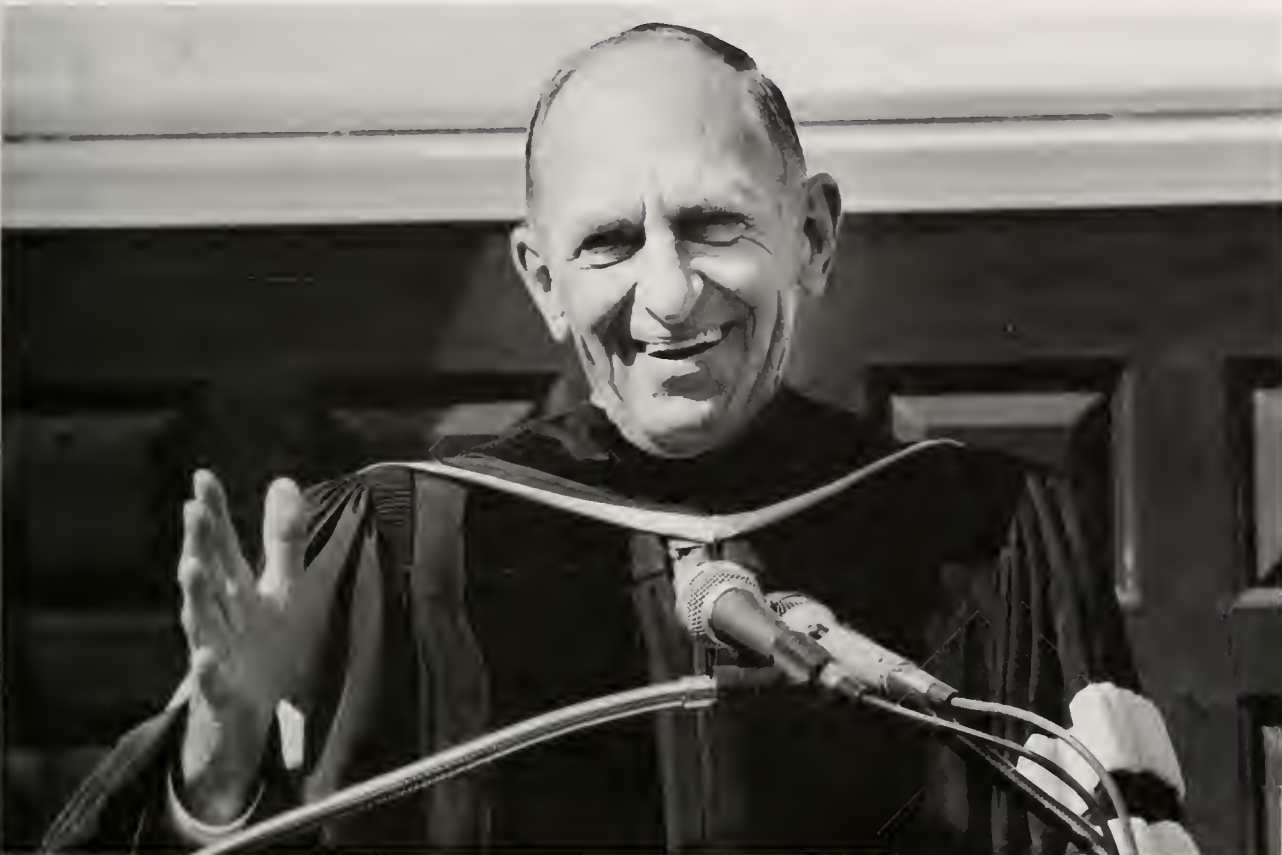
Last fall, we fully implemented the student services center for our full-time students. Staff in the center help our students make the transition to college and begin their collegiate careers on a sound academic base. The work of the center is supported by our new orientation course, College 101. In addition to helping students learn about Wesleyan, College 101 afforded each first-year student the chance to get involved in a community service program in the Rocky Mount area.

In September 1992, we launched ADVANTAGE, an accelerated degree completion program for adults. Enrollment in ADVANTAGE grew to 175 students by May, representing 41 corporations in the Triangle area of North Carolina. Also in September, our sense of community was expanded with the beginning of broadcasting of WESQ, Wesleyan's public radio station. By the spring of 1994, we expect that the station will be on the air for 18 hours a day, each day of the week.

For over 30 years, discussions concerning the building of an auditorium and fine arts center on campus have excited the imaginations at the College and in the community. At present we have obtained \$4.7 million in gifts and pledges towards the total cost of \$6.5 million. Architects have completed working drawings for the auditorium, and drawings for the renovation of the original campus power plant as a fine arts classroom building should be completed during the fall of 1993.

The mission of North Carolina Wesleyan College is to help our students and our community prepare for the future. Our degree programs afford students the opportunity to acquire the intellectual capacity to be effective citizens in a world of change and complexity. Our public service programs enrich the cultural and educational life of our region. None of this work would be possible without the continued support of individuals working together to make Wesleyan's philosophy a reality.

Dr. Leslie H. Garner, Jr. introduces the speaker:
I am pleased to have your participation in our celebration of the vision and leadership of the men and women who established this college in 1956. It was not long after that founding day in 1956 that Raymond Bauer moved to Rocky Mount to join the faculty. He was one of the first members of this faculty, and he has served our students, his colleagues and his community distinction. He will retire in June, after having been part of the life of this college since the first students arrived in the fall of 1960. Dr. Bauer is, to the best of my knowledge, the only member of our faculty who has played professional baseball. He played in the Chicago Cubs organization. He pitched for Wake Forest College in the world

series, and he has served as baseball coach and athletic director at Wesleyan. Coach Bauer understands that the real wins in athletics are measured by the successful lives of graduates.

Dr. Bauer has been a favorite professor of Wesleyan students for three decades. He has taught physical education, but he has, in reality taught much more. Visual Arts 1992-93



The Visual Art Minor began in the fall of 1992 with a Two-Dimensional Design studio in the "pink" room, 236 Braswell. Students were introduced to some of the fundamentals of pictorial and graphic design as well as basic production techniques in painting, paste-up and linking. Students chose one germinal image and word; this same image/word remained constant as they worked through pictorial evolution from simple black and white illustration to color abstraction and montage.

Supplementing the traditional Wesleyan major, the new Visual Arts Minor is intended to furnish Wesleyan students with a practical foundation in "visual literacy." Thus, in the spring of 1993 Three Dimensional Design was offered. Students learned the aesthetics of structure, sculpture and the functional application of display fabrication. Using a variety of readily-available materials to produce durable and temporary prototype constructions their work ranged from the minute to the monumental.

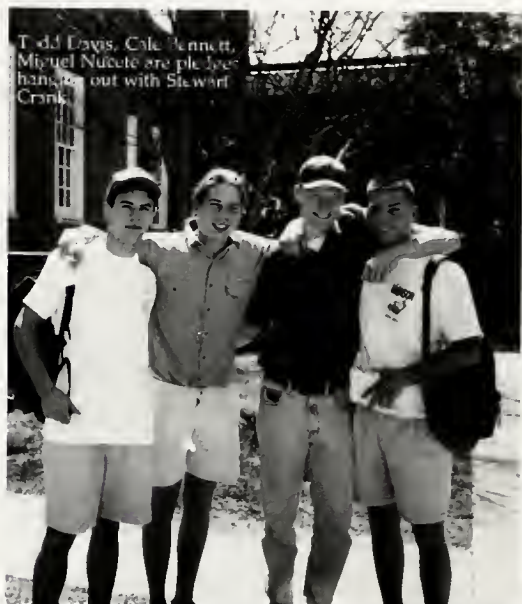

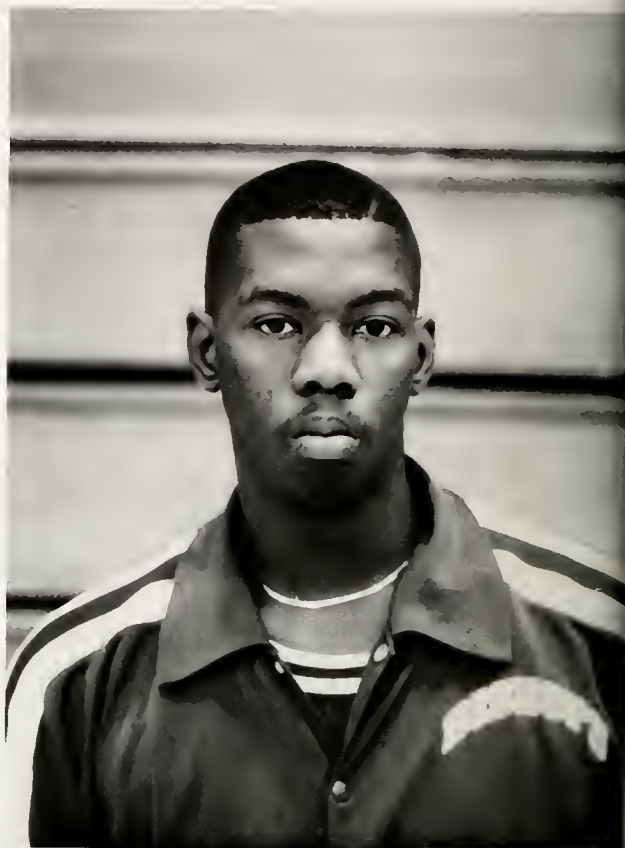

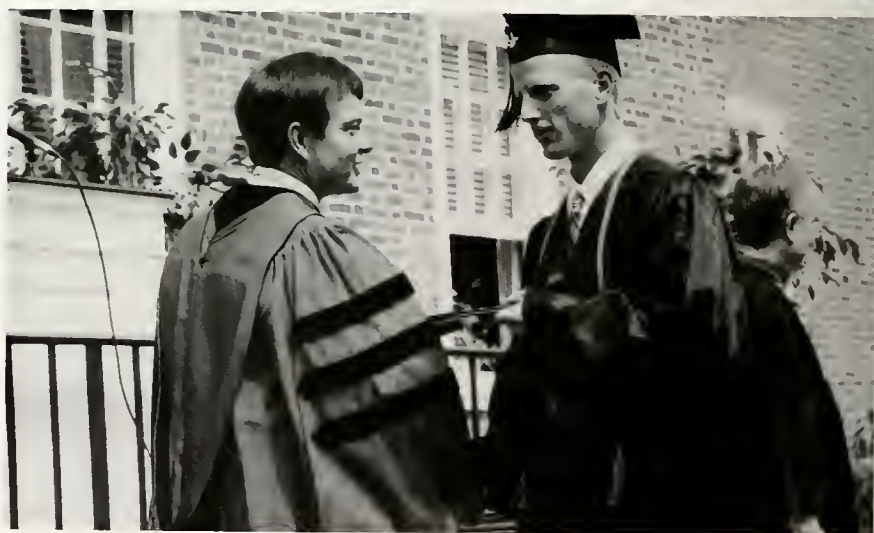

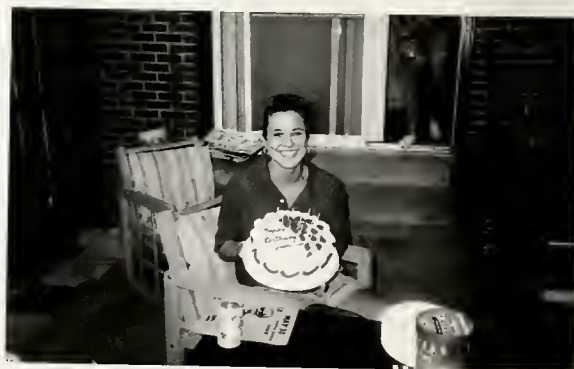
