



A Message From Our President . . .

As the 1993-94 academic year closes, we look forward to next year which promises to be full of developments in our programs to serve students and community.

We continue to strive for programs of distinctive quality, serving full-time students and working adults. As we contemplate the demands that will face these students as they lead us into the next century, we see three important areas of emphasis.

First, we must seek leadership in learning. Wesleyan has always been blessed with a talented and committed faculty. Traditionally, we have sought to nurture and reward excellence in teaching. While we continue to seek such excellence, we must go beyond our traditional conception of high quality in the classroom. The future demands that students and faculty work more closely as partners in learning, joining forces in the classroom and in learning opportunities outside the classroom. To prepare students to face the increasingly rapid pace of knowledge creation, we must create more opportunities to join

with them in research and learning.

Second, we must focus our shared energies on what we have come to call "vital skills." We hear uniformly from employers that college graduates entering the workforce need more than ever the capacities to write, communicate, solve problems, think critically and logically and work as a member of a team. These vital skills must be part of every major and every program at the College if our students are to meet these demands.

The third theme is work and service. We aspire to create a rigorous program at Wesleyan, integrating the

discipline of work with the discipline of study. Internships in the community and campus work study programs can enrich the college experience for our students.

Next year might well be one of the most significant in the life of the College in terms of its contribution to cultural activities. We are nearing the completion of the campaign to construct a performing arts center on campus, and if the spring "close out" campaign goes well, construction may begin during Fall 1994. This facility, which will include an auditorium and recital hall, along with classroom and rehearsal space, will open to college

and community opportunities in theater and music, not possible up to now.

One of the reasons for Wesleyan's progress is the loyal support of our friends and alumni. With your continued support next year, new opportunities to serve students and community will surely come our way.














