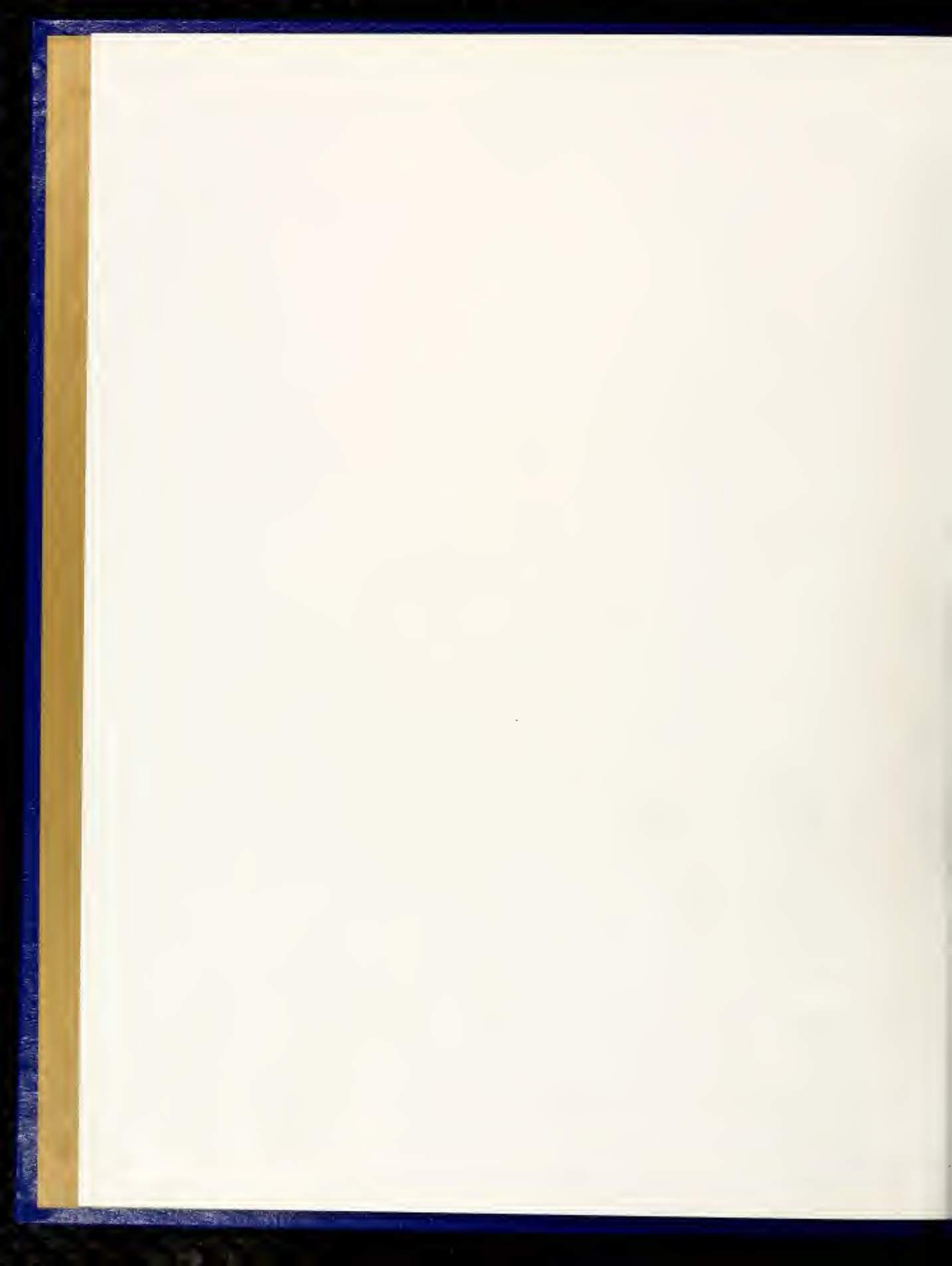

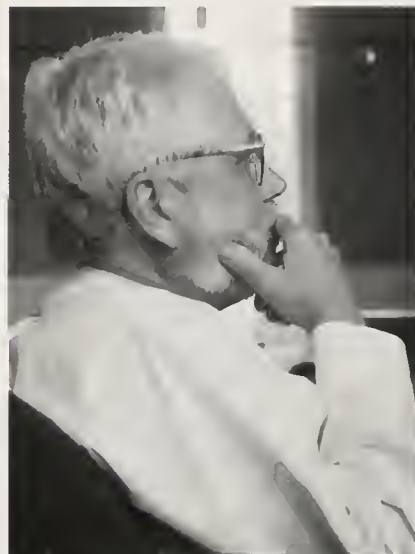

Dr. Therrien joined North Carolina Wesleyan college in 1992 as Professor of Biology and Chair of the Division of Mathematics and Science.

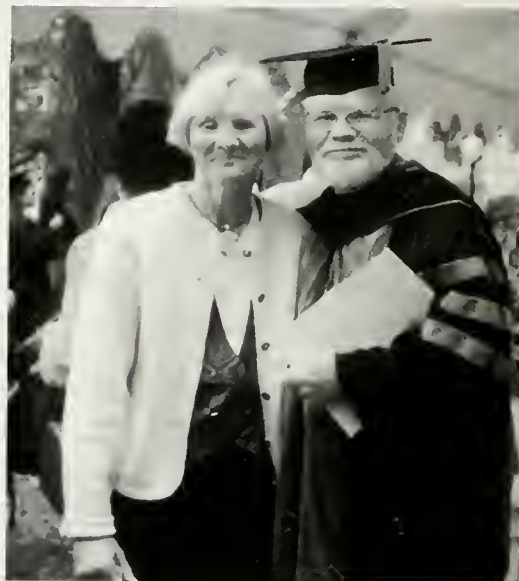

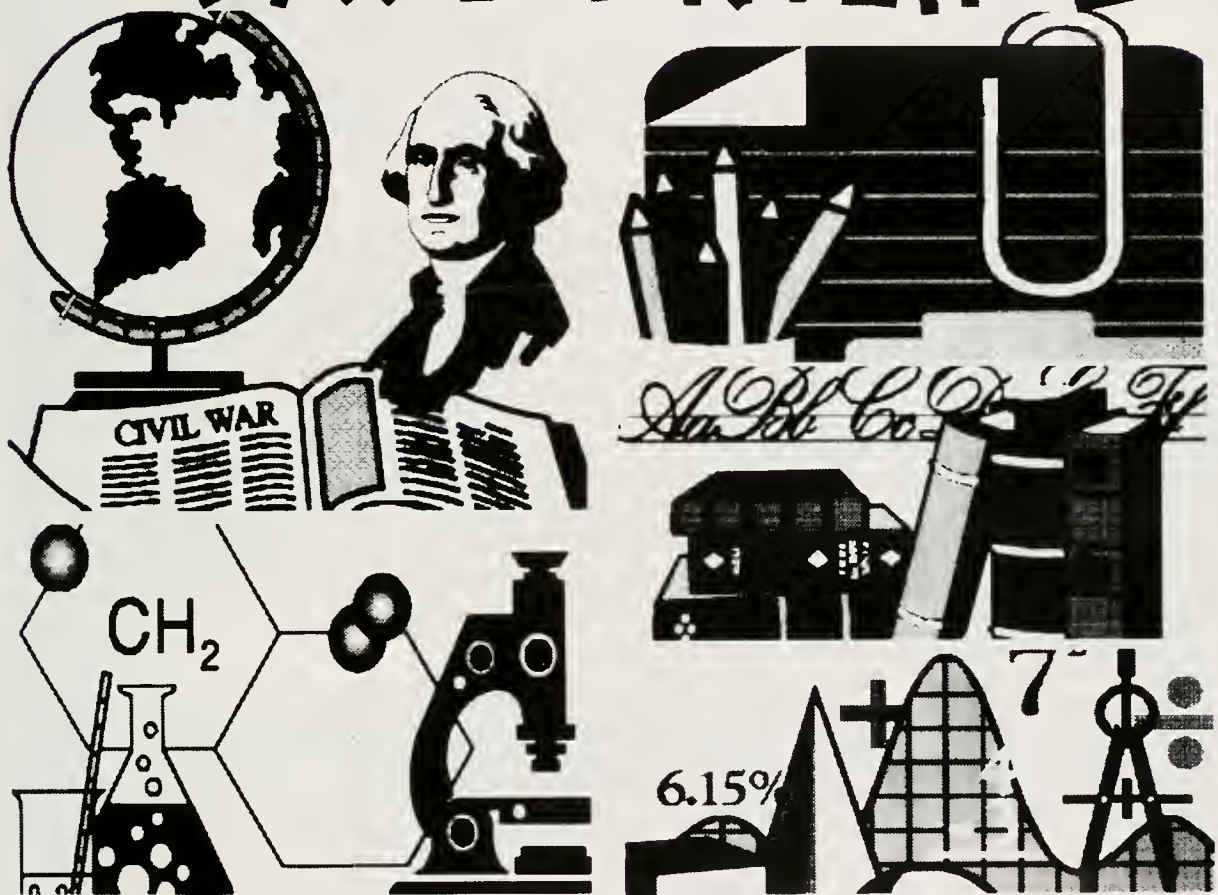

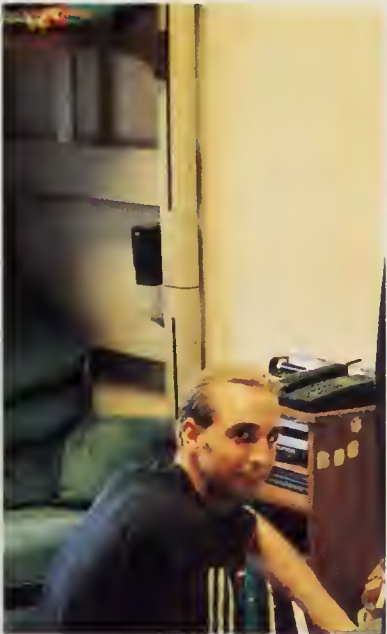

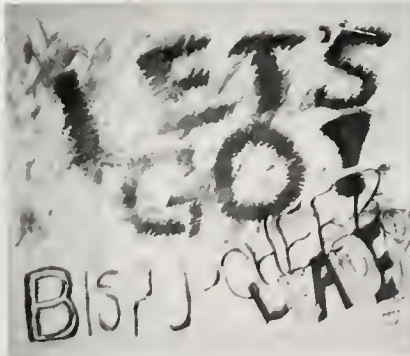

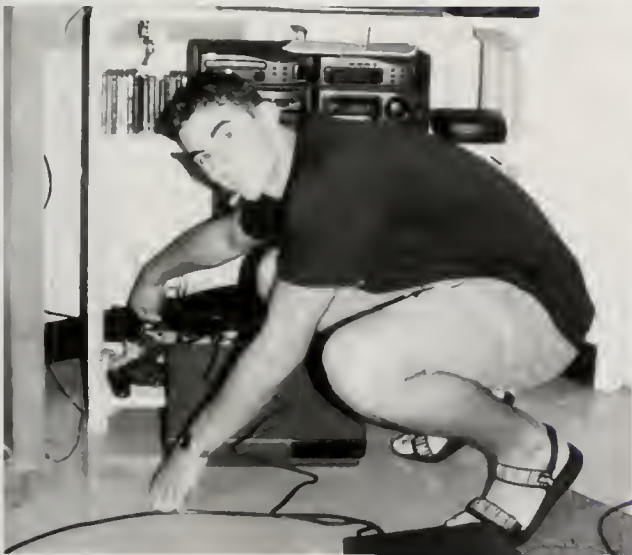

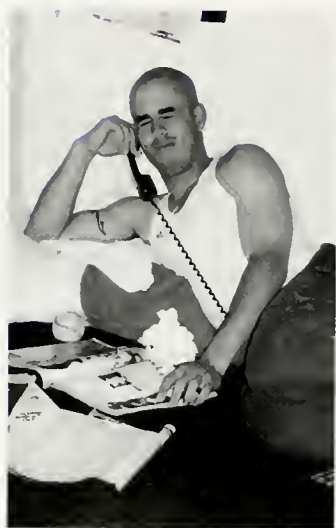

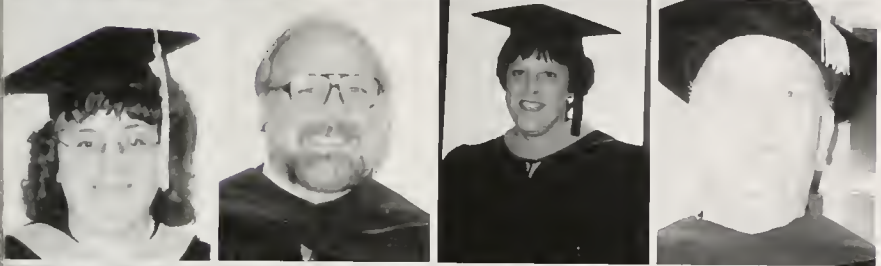

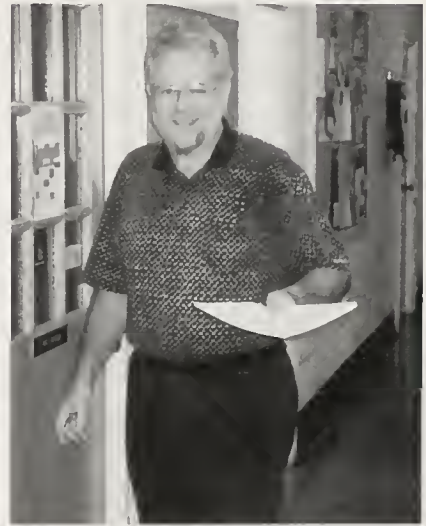

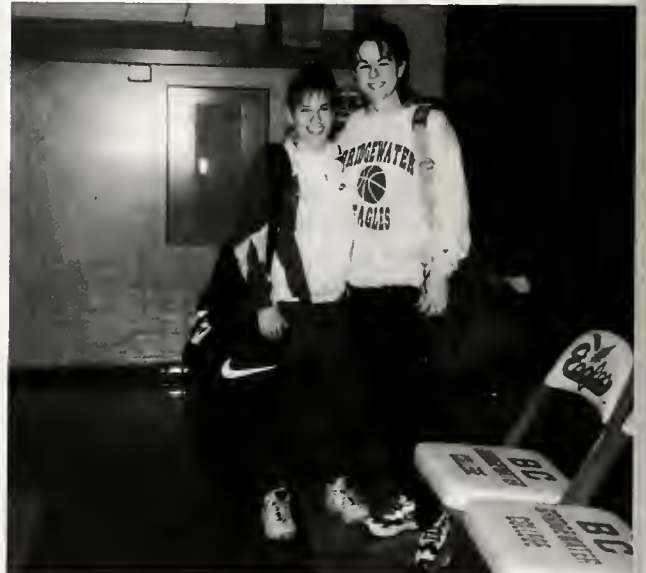

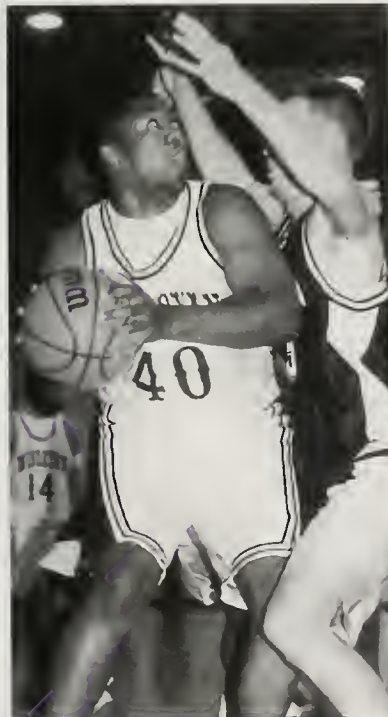

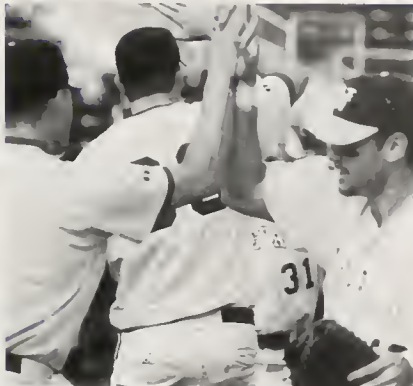
