helped make Day for Wesleyan possible.

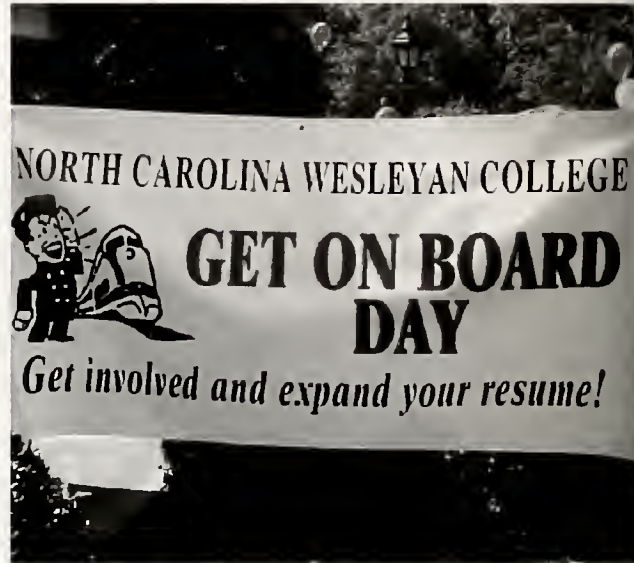
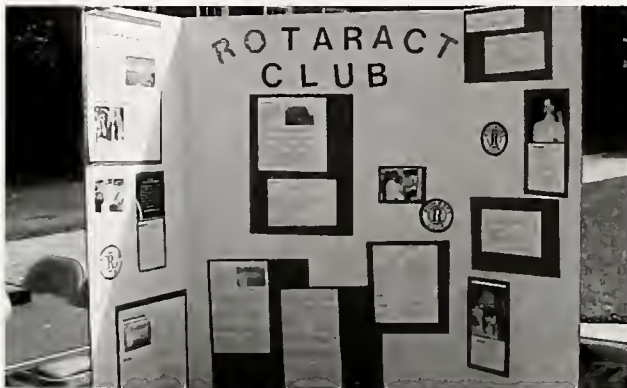
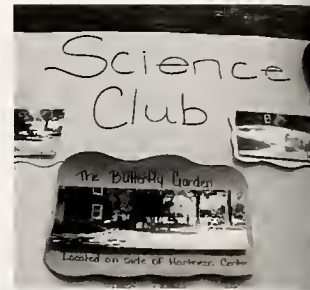

The recreation center will include a fitness center for students, a multipurpose room, a hall of fame and conference room, athletic offices, and facilities for exercise science classes.

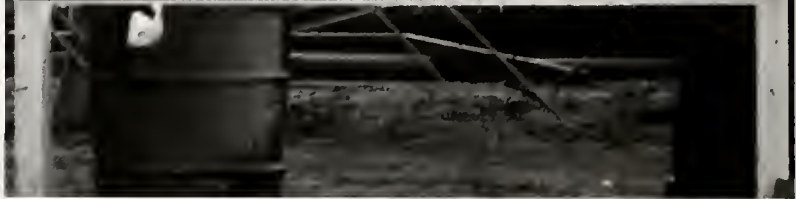
The field house will include a weight room, a training room, locker facilities for outdoor sports, and new offices for coaches.

with a so called dress code.



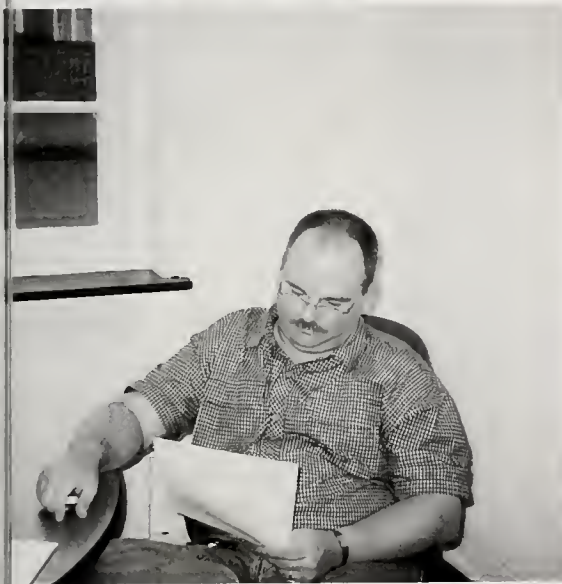

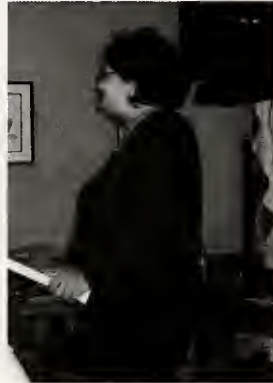

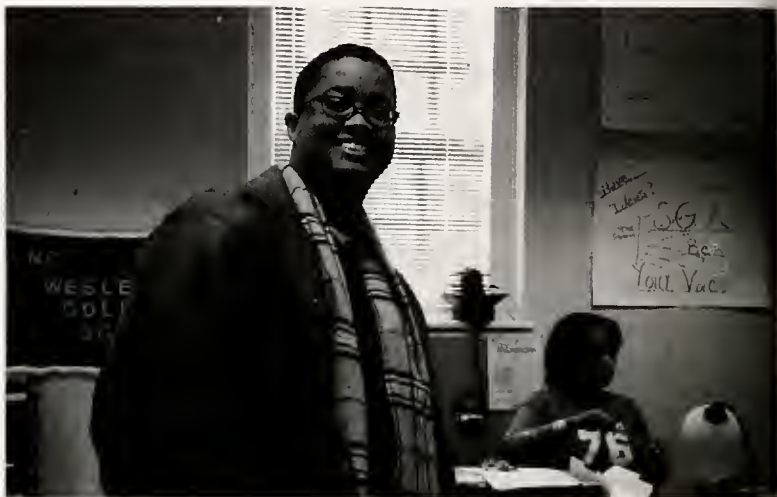

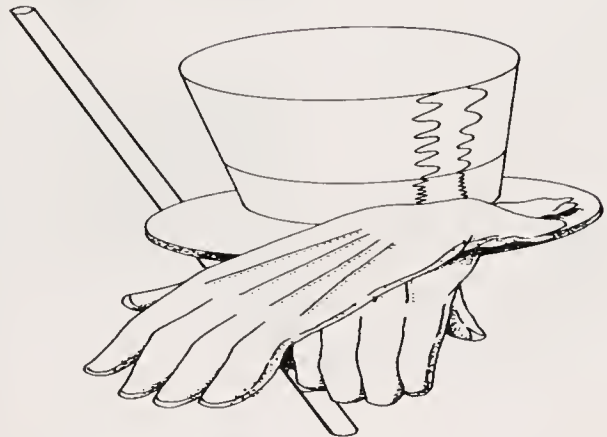
