Bolden got this angle from the talkative housemaid, Doris Blackwell, and cooks Lillian Berry, Elsie Mae Bare, Edith Andrews, Doris Bridges and Ruth Storey.

William Stafford, the butler, admitted having heard Huffman plotting an elopment with Mrs. Lee.

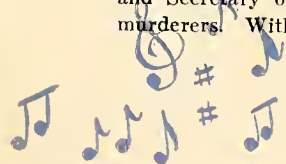
The strange thing about this case, Boss, is that there are too many motives. Here's another one. Lee was suing that king of the underground, "Killer" Kennedy (Hoyt) for forgery. A little Mrs. Betsy Riley Brady, who runs a boarding house, told our detective where Kennedy's gang was hiding out, and some of his mugs, "Two-gun" Tew, A. L. These kind gentlemen took us through the factory and we compared the weapon with the pins made there and interviewed some of the workers: Marie Wagner, Mary White, Helen Bray, Donald Sharpe, Cleo Fuquay, Rosa Isley, Madeline Foster, and Dot Frazier; sure enough, it had been made there.

Coroner Bobby Smith, just returned from a fishing trip, took one look at the victim and called the murder suicide. Some story eh, Boss? Too bad it was only a fairy tale, and now I must take the rap for libel, if someone doesn't shoot me first."
