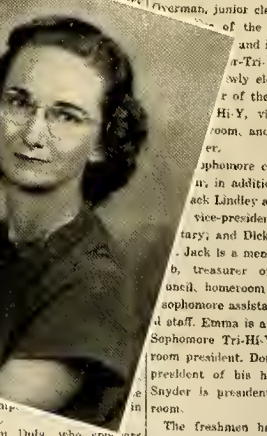
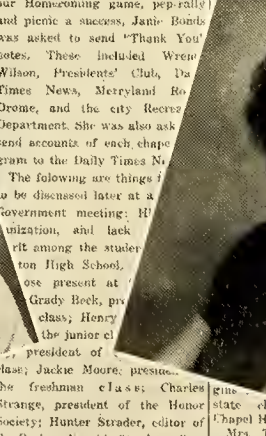
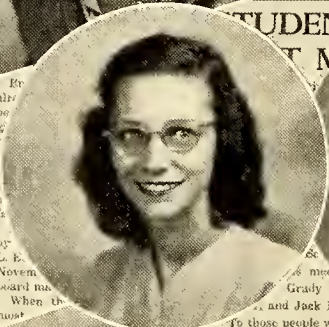
Miss Barker Conte Arouses Interest Of The Student Body
