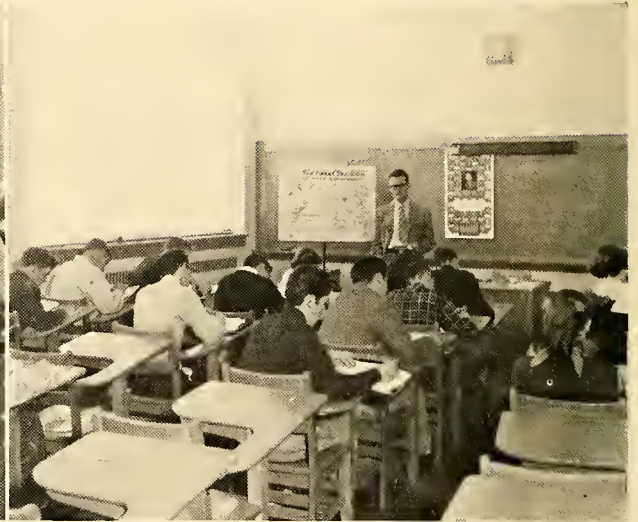
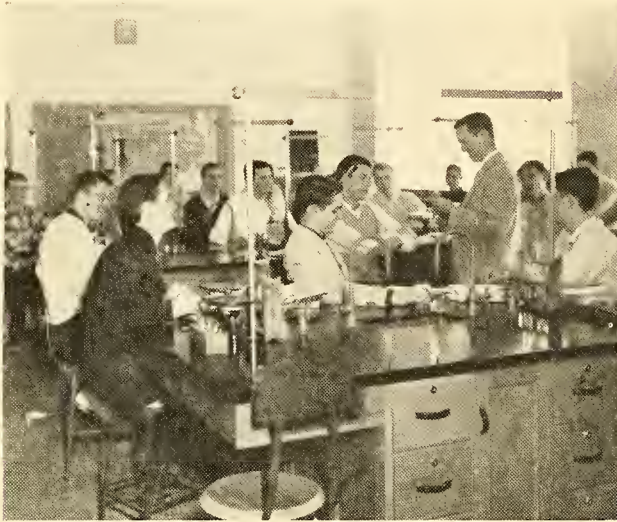
THE RECORD THAT COUNTS MOST

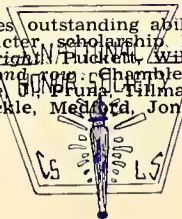
THEY HELP US KEEP OUR RECORDS CLEAN

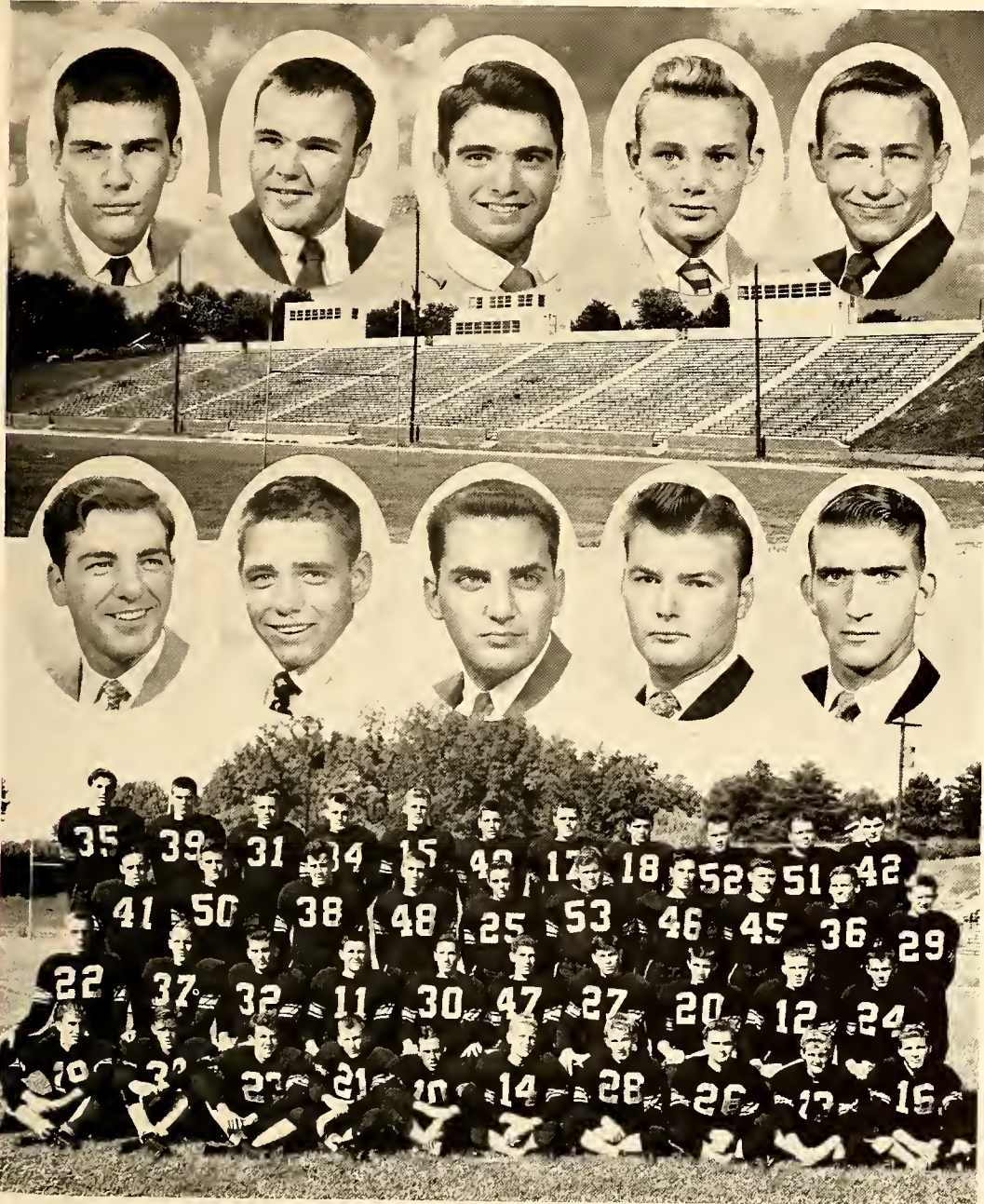
