



Foreword

This year at Williams High School has meant to us many things as we have shared experiences together. For some it has been the beginning; for others, the closing of school activities that grow in meaning and value when recorded in our yearbook.

Our Doe-Wah-Jack endeavors to convey the essence of achievements—educational, athletic, spiritual. The wonder of a printed book unfolds the happenings which we share, and it never ceases to amaze us as we look back across the four important volumes of our high school life.

From its initial publishing in 1924, our yearbook has borne a title derived from the Indian word meaning "the first." The editor of that early edition sought a name that would portray a distinct meaning through the years. When he noticed an old fashioned pot-bellied stove inscribed with the trademark, "Doe-Wah-Jack," he was inspired to use that title for the yearbook. Thus our book became the namesake of the little iron stove, portrayed on the cover of our Doe-Wah-Jack.










