

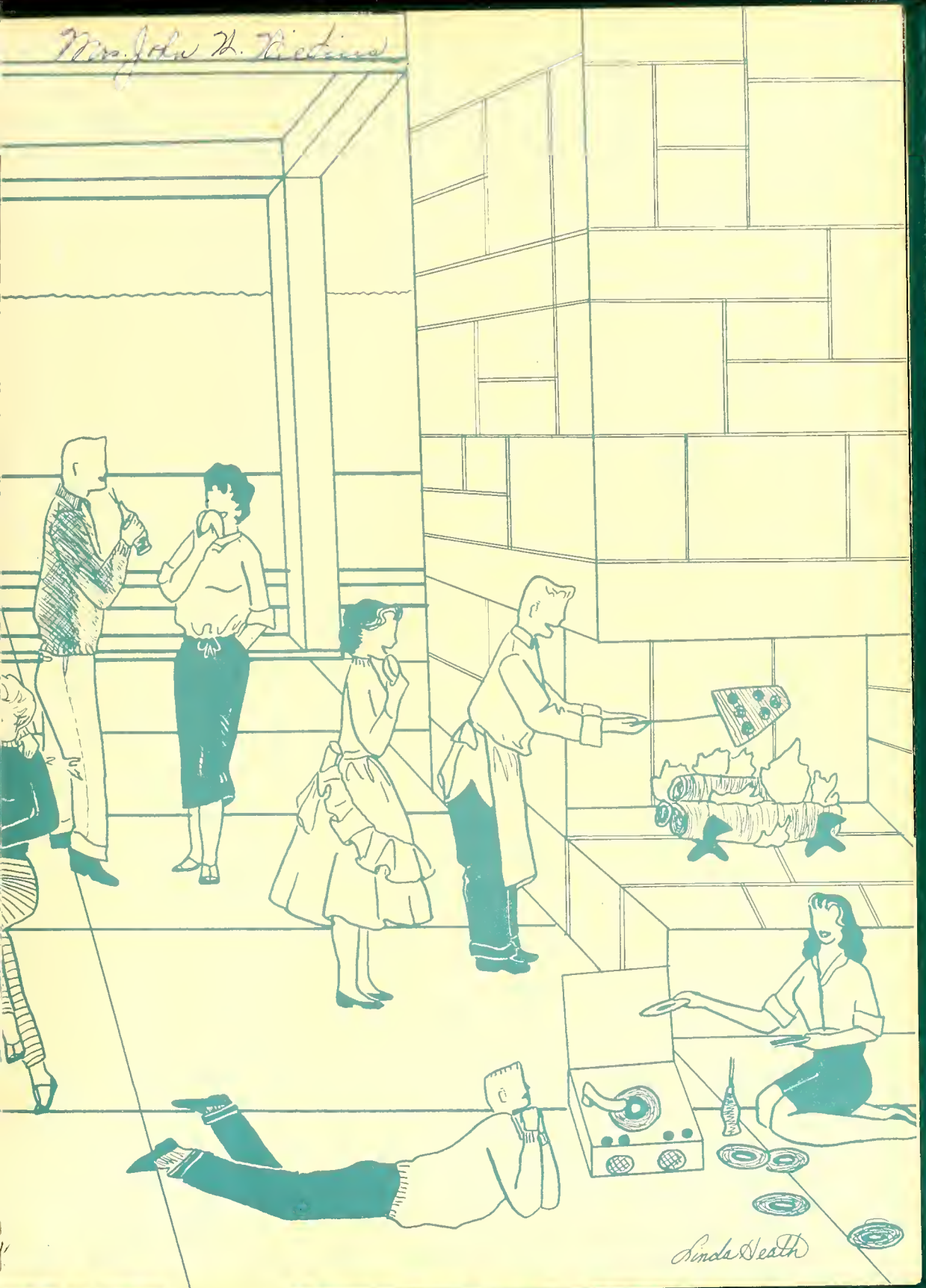

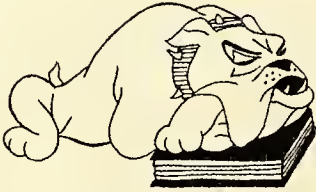

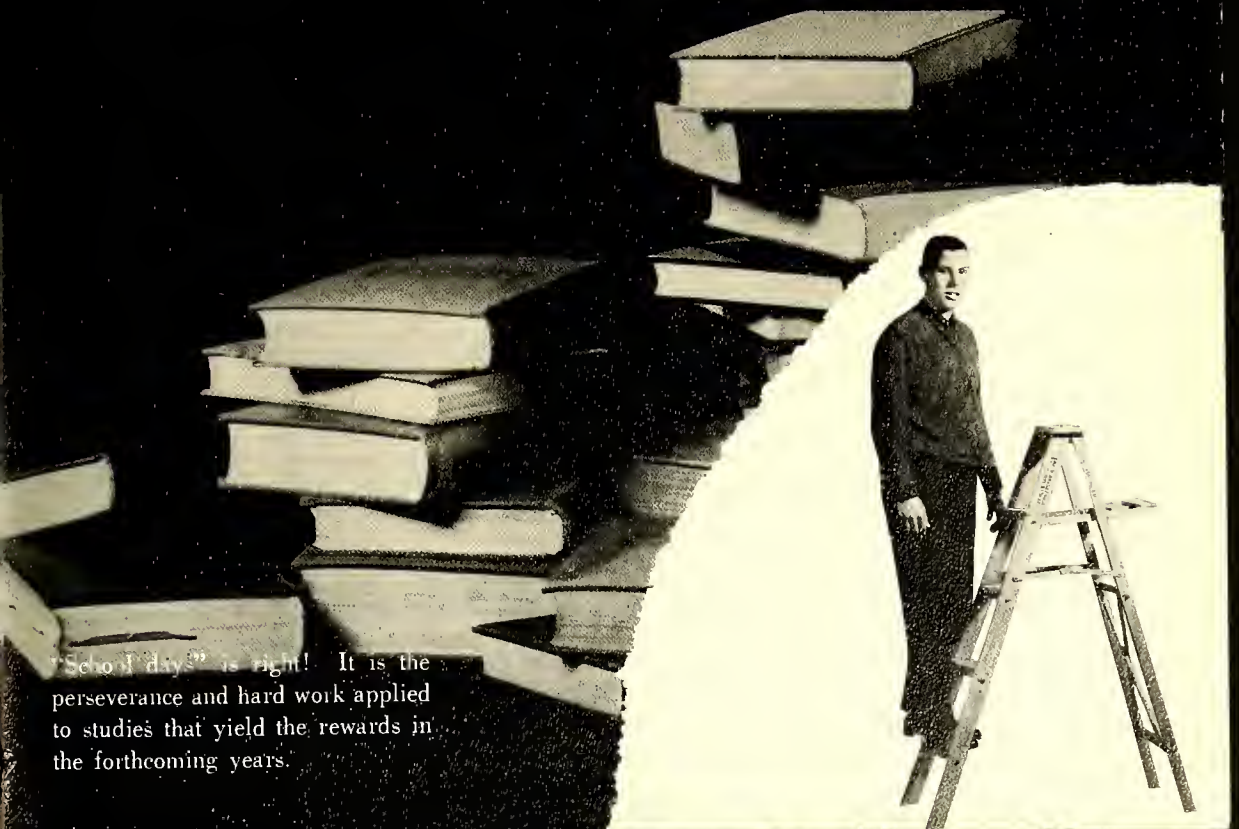
3. Examinations:

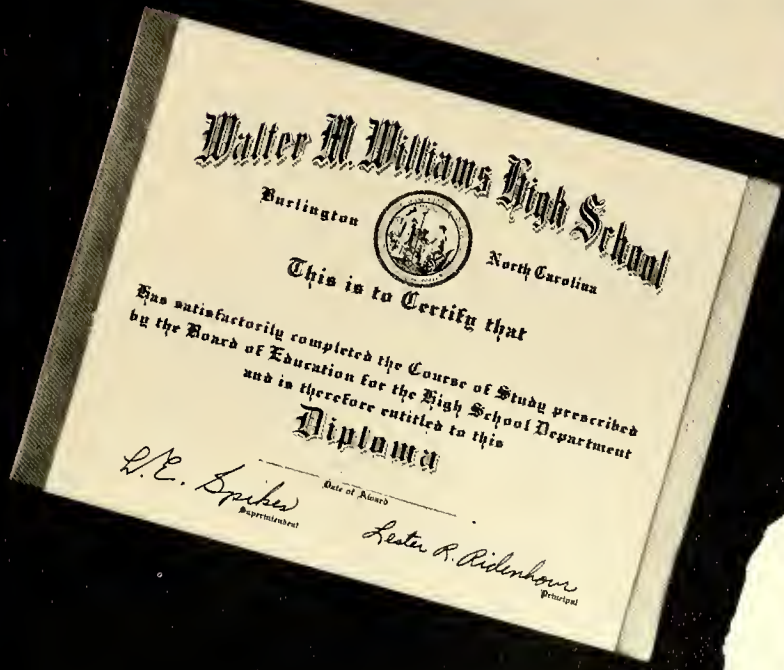

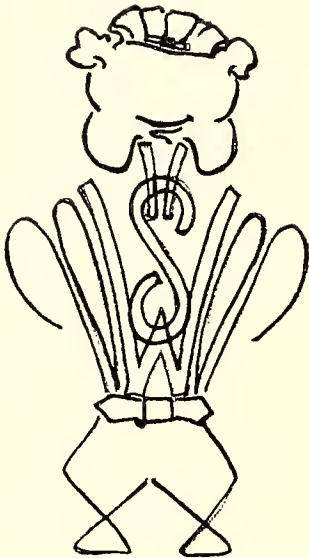

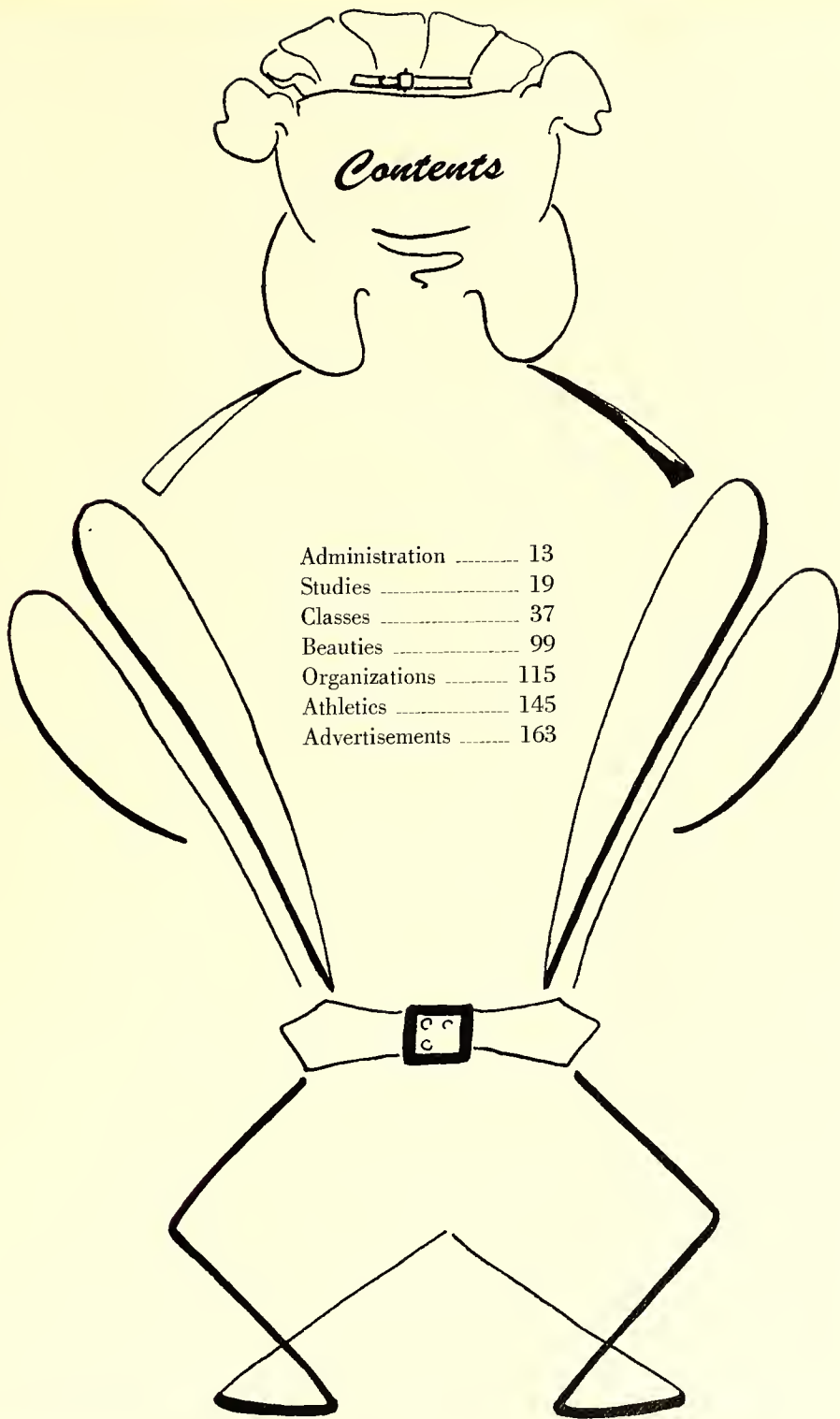
Foreword

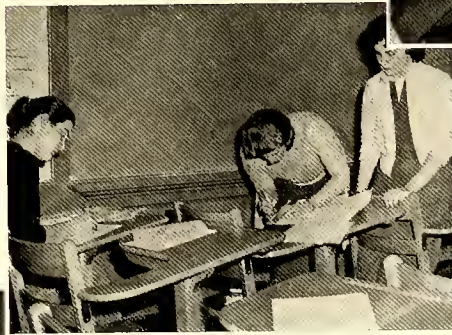

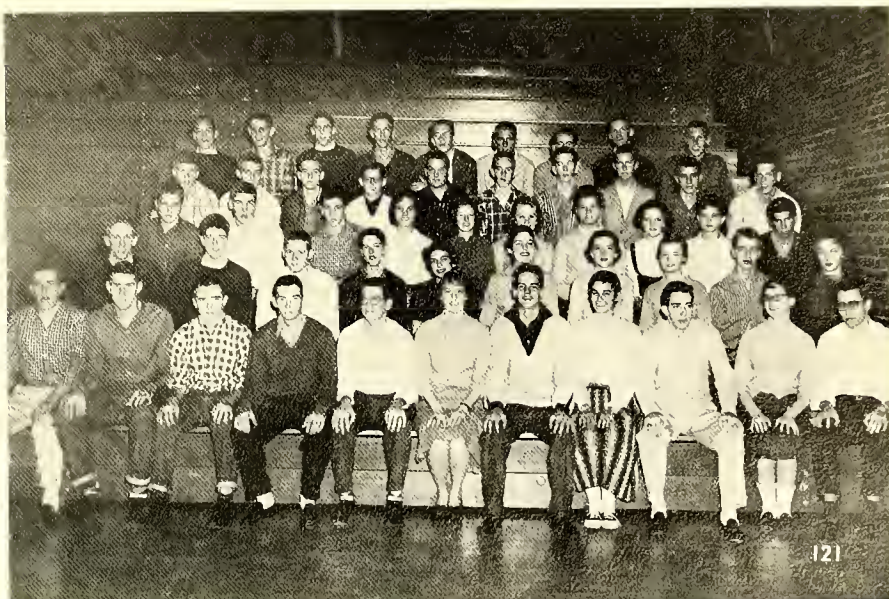

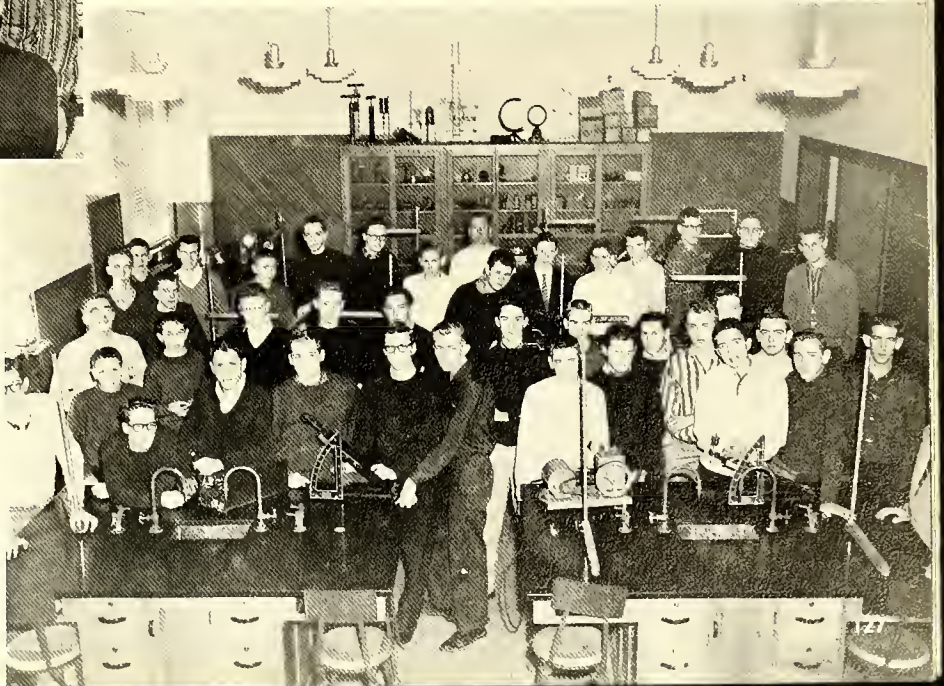

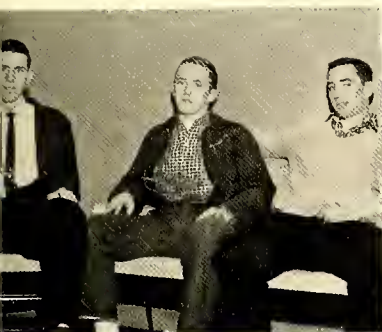

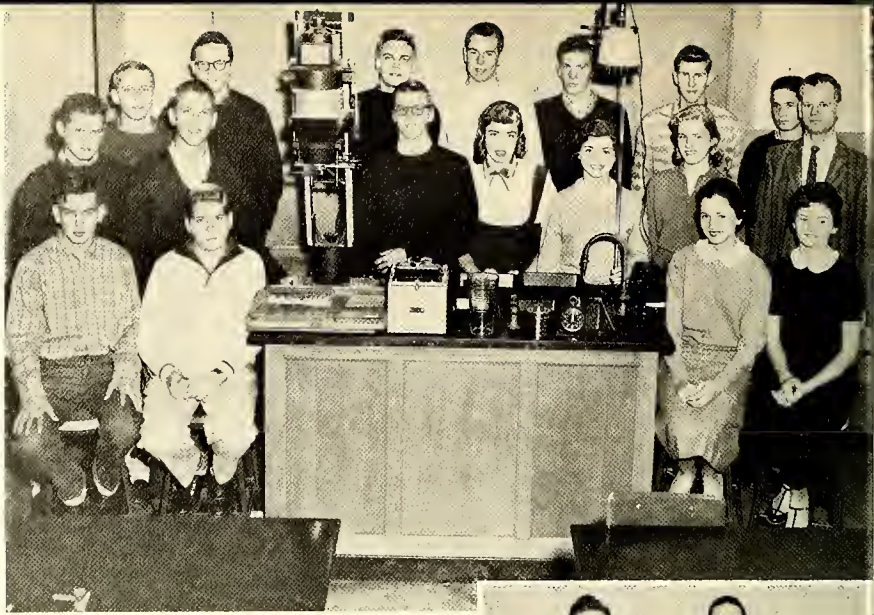

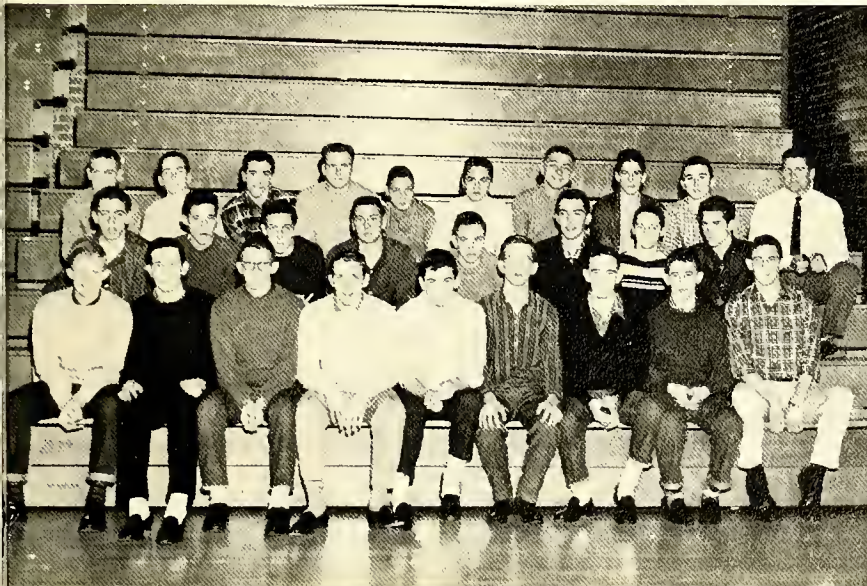

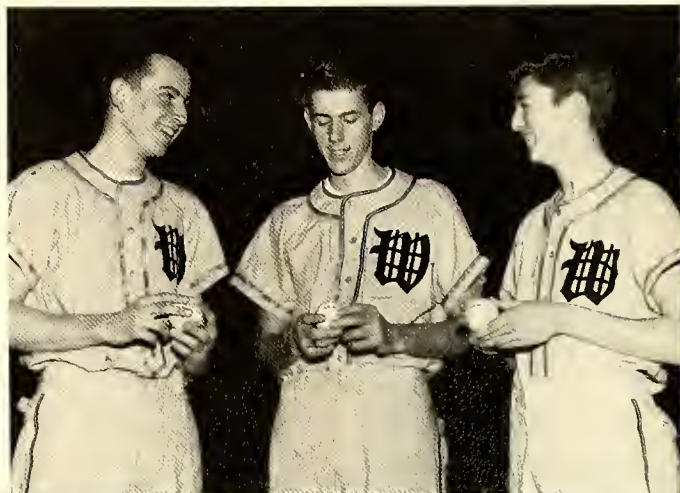
Baseball

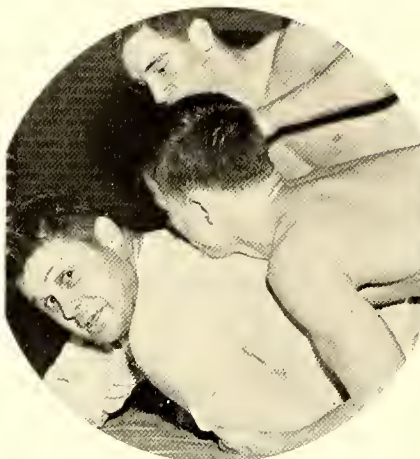
