#### Foreword


In our attempt to assemble an annual for you, the students, the 1959 DOE-WAH-JACK staff has made some deviations from the set pattern.

As we did all these things, there was one thought in our minds. The students must like their book!










This year with twelve returning lettermen, many of whom are two year veterans, the team should represent our school well in conference play.





Prospects for the '59 team are relatively bright and with a few breaks the team could pull some upsets.










The 1958 tennis team completed the most successful year in the history of the sport here at W.H.S. In compiling their eight won, no loss season, they defeated several of the top powers in the state.
