OUR HERITAGE

orth Carolina had no community college in 1960 when Pasquotank County residents voted 70 percent to 30 percent to establish a new college in Elizabeth City, making College of The Albemarle the first community college in the state. Less than a year later, 113 students were enrolled at COA for the first time. Today, the College is one of the premier community colleges in North Carolina with outstanding academic programs, a distinguished faculty, state-of-the-art facilities and more than 7,000 alumni. Currently, approximately 3000 students are enrolled at the three campuses of COA.

The founders of the College wanted a college that embodied the total collegiate experience - academic, social, and physical. In order to support its belief, the College fielded its first athletic team in 1963. Intercollegiate athletics was meeting the needs of many of its students during the 14 years the program was operational. Throughout the 1960's and the 1970's College of The Albemarle's athletics were a source of school pride and spirit on campus.



COA teams performed well. In 1976 the baseball team earned the right to play in the National Junior College World Series Championship in Grand Junction, Colorado. Unfortunately, in 1977 the Board of Trustees succumbed to financial pressures and reluctantly discontinued intercollegiate athletics.

The visionary spirit instilled by the College's founders and local voters in 1960 remains intact today. College of The Albemarle is proud of its heritage and it is the College's vision to once again offer intercollegiate athletics.
