After the game, Pittsboro received the trophies for

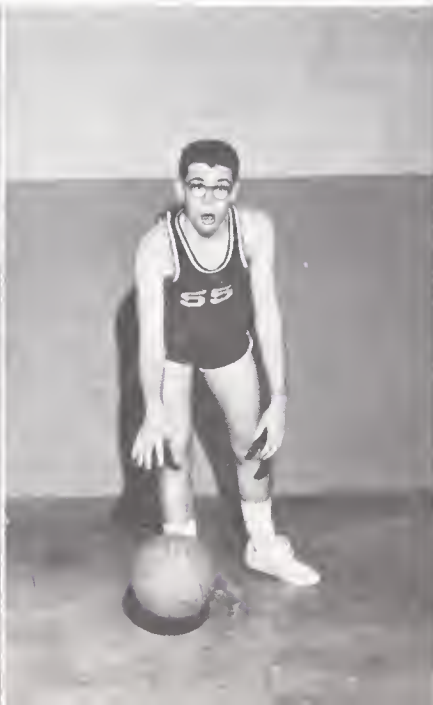
