the nets at Wella Wella Falls.

Dorsal fin same as that of *Syngnathus*
color orange and paler to white
at base.

Anal fin same as dorsal fin

Ventral fin same as dorsal
tail and top of head flat brown

Colors

Same as the *Syngnathus*
except that the anal fin
is more yellow and bronze
Back flat, convex
lighter yellow bronze
belly and sides pearl white
gill covers gold and bronze

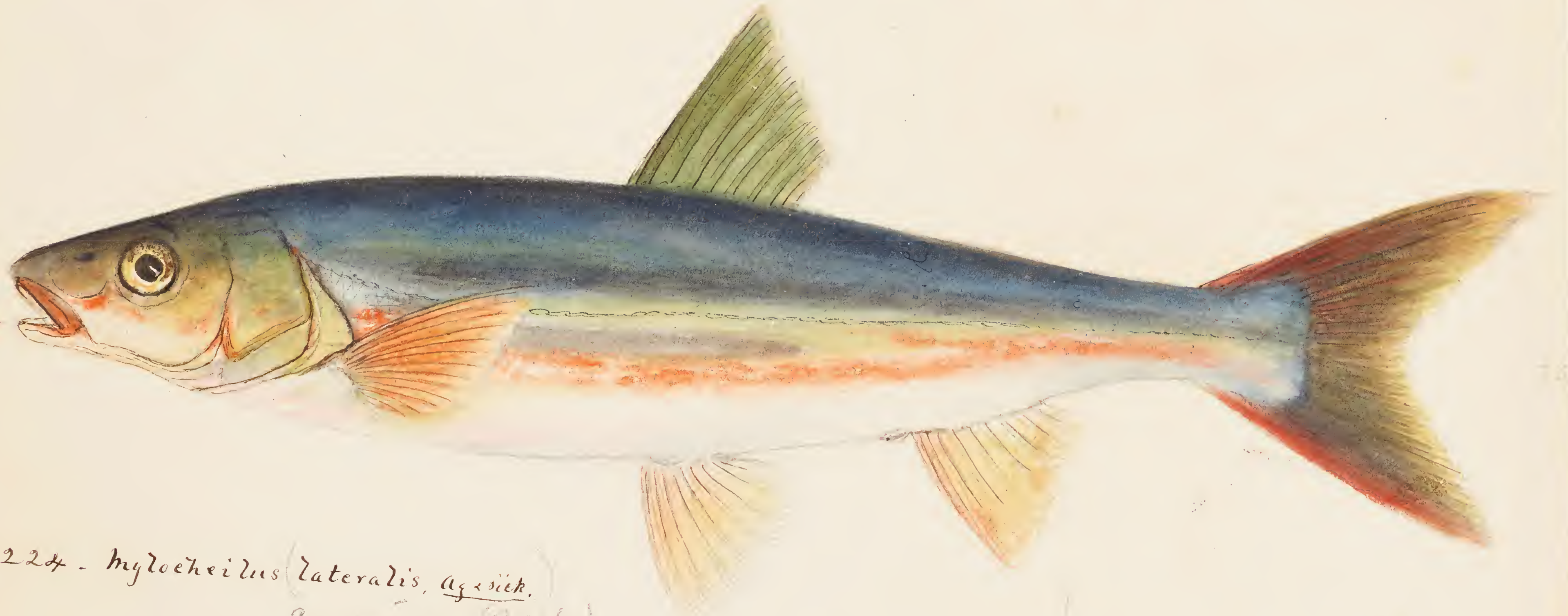

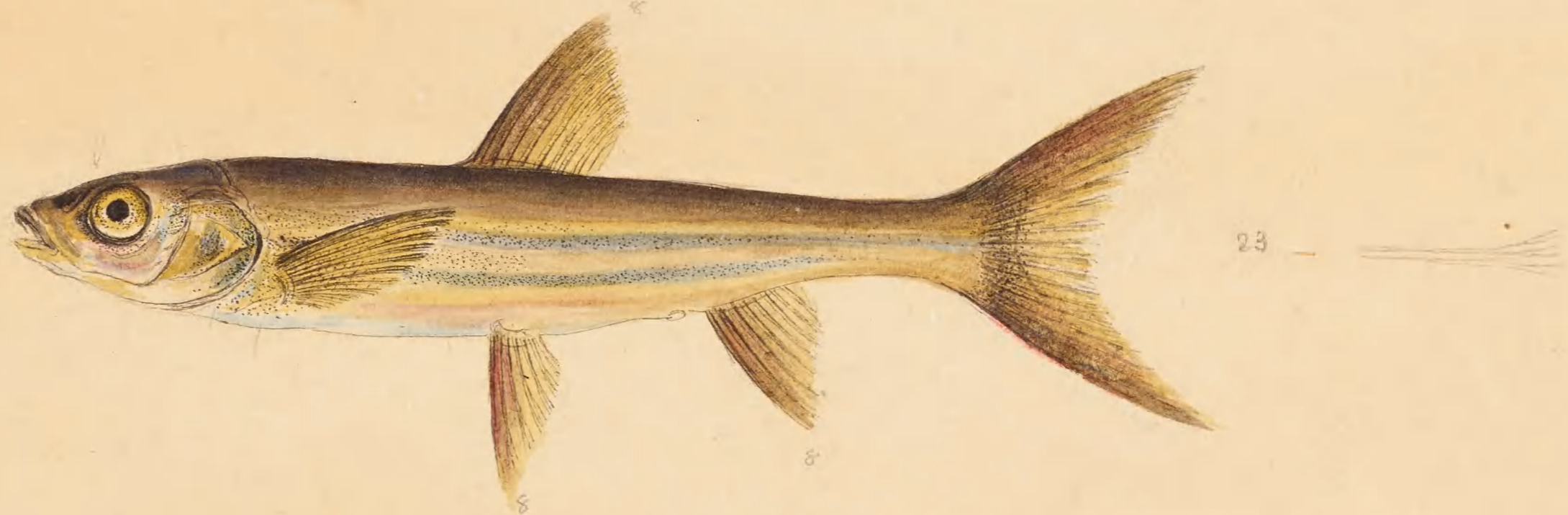
Notes.
