most complete in the country, consisting of a full line of all sizes, from small seedlings for growing on, to specimens of the most useful decorative sizes; all are in a clean, healthy and vigorous condition, thrifty and well grown. We now devote 50 large houses (over 200,000 square feet of glass) covering five acres of ground to this class of plants alone, while we give close attention to all other desirable Florists' Stock.
