We also offer a choice lot of pot-grown STRAWBERRY plants, and CELERY and CABBAGE plants, which are grown in large quantities at our RIVERTON NURSERIES; also VEGETABLE and FLOWER seeds for SUMMER sowing, and a special list of BULBS for FORCING.

Unless advised to the contrary we ship all orders for Bulbs as soon as they arrive; BERMUDA LILIES, FREESIAS and CALLA LILY BULBS about the middle of July; ROMAN HYACINTHS, PAPER WHITE NARCISSUS and LILIUM LONGIFLORUM about the middle of August; DUTCH HYACINTHS, TULIPS and the general run of Dutch bulbs early in September; LILY OF THE VALLEY, SPIREA and HELLEBORUS in November. Any of our friends desiring their bulbs held back until all can be sent in one shipment, will please notify us to that effect.

LOW EXPRESS RATES ON PLANTS.

We are shipping by all express lines to any part of the country, plants packed in closed boxes at a reduction of 20 per cent. from regular rates of merchandise. Boxes weighing less than 100 pounds are charged at pound rates, minimum charge not less than 35 cents. For example: where the general rate is \$5.00 per 100 pounds, a box weighing 20 pounds will be carried for 80 cents. Prepaid 4 pound packages of seeds, plants and bulbs are carried to California and all distant points for 30 cents each.

TERMS OF BUSINESS.

Unknown correspondents desiring to open an account will please furnish satisfactory reference, otherwise cash must accompany order.

Remittances should be made by Post Office Money Orders, Drafts on New York or Philadelphia banks, or Express Money Orders. Where it is not possible to obtain these, the letter should be registered. We cannot guarantee receipt of money sent in any other way.

Perishable goods desired C. O. D. must be accompanied by a partial remittance to guarantee acceptance.

Unless otherwise specified, purchases between January 1st and June 30th are due and payable July 1st following. Purchases between July 1st and December 31st are due and payable January 1st following.

No charge is made for boxes or packing, nor for delivery to Freight Depots or Express Offices.

Our pot-grown Strawberry plants are ready for shipment about the middle of July, and can be supplied as late as October in such varieties as are unsold at that time.

It is better, however, to procure the plants in August or September, as earlier plantings will develop larger and more vigorous plants and produce a greater crop of fruit next year, besides, we are usually sold out of many varieties later in the season.

CELERY PLANTS.



Celery plants can be supplied from June 15th to August 25th. We grow the following varieties, which we offer at the uniform price of

30 cts. per 100.

Celery requires a moist, rich soil, and will not thrive in poor soil and dry situations. the plants have attained a height of 5 or 6 inches they should be set out in rows three feet apart and six inches in the row. When twelve to fifteen inches high, the soil should be loosened by the use of the plow or hoe and the plants be "handled." This operation consists of drawing the stems upright with one hand, and pressing the soil firmly against the plant with the other; by this process the plants grow upright and can be easily cultivated and blanched by drawing the soil close up to the plant. Celery should receive thorough cultivation if good results are desired. To store for winter use, select well drained ground, dig trenches I foot wide and deep enough to cover the tops of the plants. Pack the stalks in this in an upright position, covering with boards to shed the water, and in severe weather protect with straw or leaves.

White Plume. This is a very ornamental variety. while its qualities are equal to the best, being crisp, solid, and having that nutty flavor peculiar to some of the red kinds.

Golden Self-Blanching. An early, beautiful, and in every way desirable sort, requiring but little labor to blanch. The heart is a rich golden yellow, with light yellowish green outer leaves. Of dwarf, compact habit, rich nutty flavor and an excellent sort for table decoration.

Giant Pascal. A superior keeping sort. stalks are very large, thick, solid, crisp, and of a rich nutty flavor, free from any trace of bitterness; it blanches very easily and quickly, and retains its freshness a long time after being marketed. heart is golden yellow, very full and attractive in appearance.

Perfection Heartwell. A large solid growing variety of excellent flavor and creamy white color. In size it is between the Golden Dwarf and White It is an excellent market sort, as the stalks are clear and attractive in color.

New Rose. In this variety we have a combination of the best qualities of Celery. The red sorts surpass the white in flavor, and possess in their coloring a valuable feature as a table ornament.

Hungarian Grass. (Panicum Germanicum). An annual forage-plant of great value. It flourishes during the heat of summer, remaining green when almost all other vegetation is dried up. It is one of the very best plants for green fodder, or for ensilaging, and makes hay of the best quality. It can be seeded at any time from June to October at the rate of 10 to 15 lbs. per acre and makes the earliest possible spring pasture, blooming the latter part of April or May, and for feeding as hay should be cut when in full bloom.
