Sander & Co., of England, for the purpose of collecting rare Orchids and other tropical plants, and who, with considerable difficulty, succeeded in sending the plant to England, where it was carefully nursed and propagated until the spring of 1901, when we succeeded in buying the entire stock, which then consisted of nearly one thousand plants, at a price far in excess of any ever before paid for a decorative plant of any kind.
