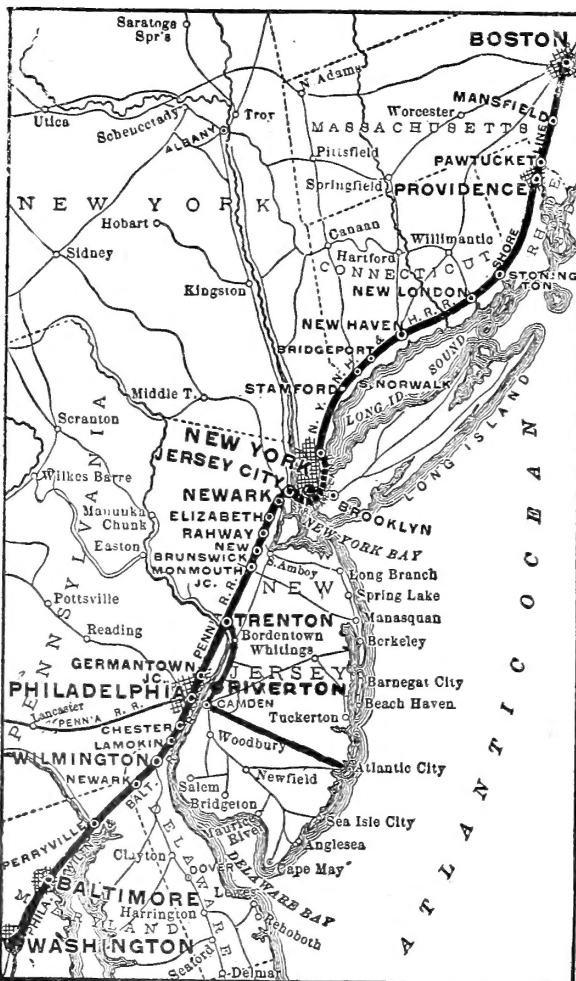

It was very aptly described by a visitor to our nursery as "an aristocratic *Asparagus Sprengeri*," from which, however, it is entirely distinct, both in its habit of growth, as well as in the formation of its fronds. The plant is of an almost erect habit of growth, producing fronds from two to four feet long, which, when just unfolding, are of a peculiar metallic bronze, from which they change to a golden-green, finally maturing a rich emerald-green. A plant with fronds in the various stages of development is most attractive.

It was awarded a certificate of merit by the Society of American Florists, August, 1903; also by the Pennsylvania Horticultural Society in November, 1903.

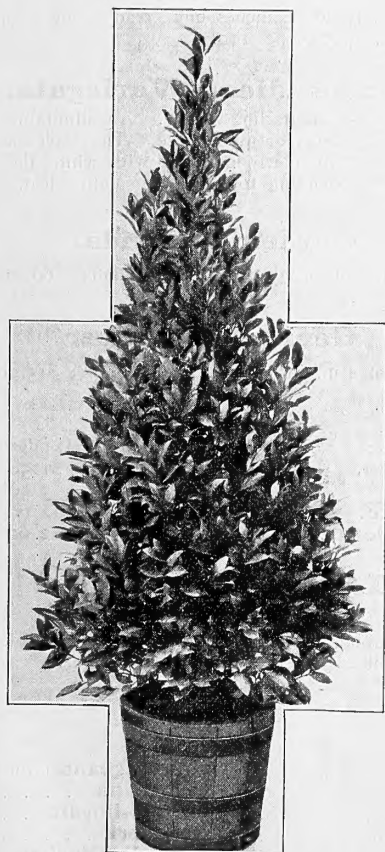
