This fact is particularly appreciated by the leading Landscape Architects throughout the country who use Perennials in large quantity, the majority of whom give preference to the Dreer pot-grown plants. It will be noticed that the majority of the stock offered in this list is described as being 3, 4 or 5-inch pots. This does not necessarily mean that the plants have been altogether pot-grown, but that they have been field-grown and dug and potted up during the Fall and early Winter months, and such stock can be planted, even late in the Spring, with practically no loss, which, in the case of clumps, is often quite serious.
