FOREWORD

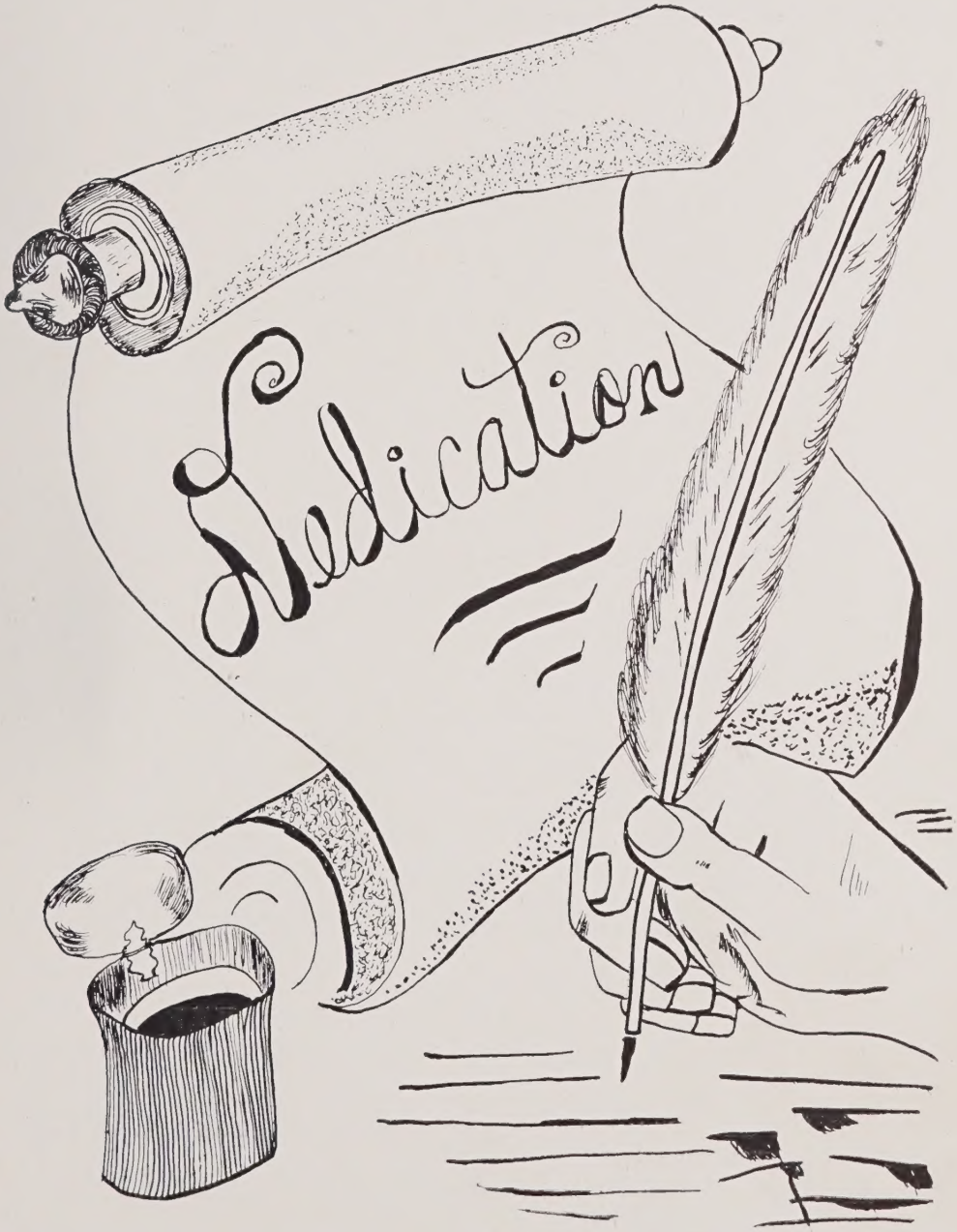
FOLLOWING a tradition of many years, the Class of 1948 is presenting a cross section of the program of activities of Washington High School in its annual, "The Echo."

“A BACKWARD GLANCE”

As helpers he had vice-president, Martha Brown; secretary, Mary Ashe; assistant secretary, Mary Jenkins; treasurer, Thomas Cooke, and reporter, Eleanor Bonner.

We observed that our trip would be made more enjoyable if we would participate in the activities scheduled. There were many to meet our interests and needs. Some of our group were recognized to have special aptitudes which made us very proud of them. Several of our fellow-passengers were found to possess great athletic ability. They were: Johnny Adcock, James Lassiter, Jack Marsh, Samuel McGuire and William Wilder. The journey was livened by frequent stops for a number of parties and occasions of gaiety.

With the passing of time we were again shifted, this time being placed in the junior coach with 130 jolly members of whom passenger Thomas Cooke was elected president, with the assistance of the following: vice-president, James Stallings; secretary, Casper Lilly; assistant secretary, Gwendolyn Haywood; treasurer, Pauline Ray; reporter, Owen Nichols; program chairman, Eleanor Bonner, and social chairman, Charles Debnam.

Side trips were made to the Scholastic Field where 16 passengers were found to possess qualities of character, service and scholarship which granted them permission into the honor society, the Crown and Scepter Club. They were: Georgia Alston, Eleanor Bonner, Martha Brown, Shirley Carney, Thomas Cooke, Clinton Copeland, Viola DeLaine, Jean Eaton, Gloria Hart, Gwendolyn Haywood, Ada Jarnagin, Sarah Morgan, Owen Nichols, Pauline Ray, Margaret Wallace and Margaret Ward. A little farther along the way we made another stop celebrating “Homecoming Day.” This, we observed, was a competitive activity and altogether we decided to go in to win—and we did. We had chosen Ressie Curry as our candidate and we reigned supreme when she won the title “Miss Washington High.” One of our above mentioned social occasions was the Junior-Senior Prom. With Charles Debnam as our social chairman, many elaborate plans were made for this gala affair, and on the night of May 9, 1947, the prom was held in the school auditorium.

YESTERDAY

Everyone was at his best—the boys handsome and valiant, the girls charming and demure—all in their finest formal attire. It was an event that will long be remembered, for as its theme indicated, it was truly “A Midsummer Night’s Dream.” Having been active in all the activities in which we were allowed to participate, we were satisfied with the years’ accomplishments for we had had among us those who had been especially active in the following activities: Band, Owen Nichols, George Roberts, Alton Sharper, Herbert Chandler, Garland Sewell, James Revis, Julian Frazier, George Branch and Charles Blalock; Glee Club, Sarah Morgan, Willie Fuller, Charles Debnam, Martha Brown, Viola DeLaine, Bernice Alston, Margaret Wallace and others too numerous to mention. In the Y-teens, Sarah Morgan and Eleanor Bonner proved to be most active, attending camp and conference each summer. Space will not permit us to name each club and its members. However, we cannot forget we had quite a few who were active in the Girl’s League, Varsity Club, Camera, Dramatics, Hi-Y, Patrol, Office Staff, Student Council, Homemakers, Social Science, Business Efficiency, Latin Club, French Club, Math Club and the Cheering Squad.

Then came the happy day when the group was transferred to the senior coach with increased privileges and responsibilities, with Thomas Cooke as president. Knowing that the task of leading our group was a great one we elected as his aides: Vice-president, Emma Jones; secretary, Gwendolyn Haywood; assistant secretary, Casper Lilly; treasurer, Pauline Ray; program chairman, Viola DeLaine, and social chairman, Charles Debnam.

Frightened as we were when we entered high school—frightened as we are now with the prospects of the future—we are outward bound across the sea of life. It’s different now—we are better equipped—our luggage is up to date and we come forward with the “new look.”

Though the grade became steeper and the journey rougher, a glorious view met our eyes as we looked out on Commencement Station as it loomed in the near distance. We, who had been companions during the long journey, became even more closely united in spirit.

We, as others before us, undertook the task of publishing the yearbook, *THE ECHO*, and elected Owen Nichols as editor-in-chief, feeling that he was capable of the position.

Two of our guidance leaders, Mrs. Perrin and Mr. Hill, have remained with us since 1944. Because of their sincere interest in our progress and development and their close relationship with our personal, social and educational activities, we feel very near and dear to them—and only wait for some opportune time to express our deepest gratitude and appreciation.

“Not singly, but together” has been our watchword for the past four years and together the group has waxed sturdy and invincible.

We now stand ready for a final transfer. At Commencement Station, on the Mount of Learning, we leave the senior coach to become passengers on various roads leading through the Valley of Opportunity in the Land of the Great Beyond, to the cities of Success, Fame and Worthy Achievement.

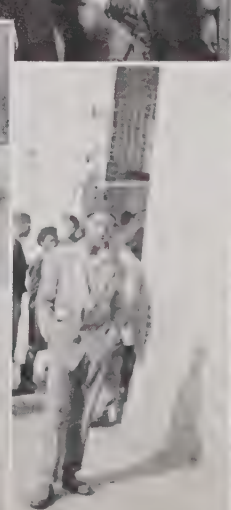
HE'S MY IDEAL BOY - - -
