FOREWORD


OLLOWING a tradition of many years, the Class of 1948 is presenting a cross section of the program of activities of Washington High School in its annual, "The Echo."





In the Y-teens, Sarah Morgan and Eleanor Bonner proved to be most active, attending camp and conference each summer. Space will not permit us to name each club and its members. We, as others before us, undertook the task of publishing the yearbook, THE ECHO, and elected Owen Nichols as editor-in-chief, feeling that he was capable of the position.

Two of our guidance leaders, Mrs. Perrin and Mr. Hill, have remained with us since 1944. Because of their sincere interest in our progress and development and their close relationship with our personal, social and educational activities, we feel very near and dear to them—and only wait for some opportune time to express our deepest gratitude and appreciation.

"Not singly, but together" has been our watchword for the past four years and together the group has waxed sturdy and invincible.

We now stand ready for a final transfer. At Commencement Station, on the Mount of Learning, we leave the senior coach to become passengers on various roads leading through the Valley of Opportunity in the Land of the Great Beyond, to the cities of Success, Fame and Worthy Achievement.





HE'S MY IDEAL BOY - - -




