How many of these graduates were still in nursing today? I thought why not do it on my graduating class of James Walker Memorial Hospital, Wilmington, North Carolina. We had graduated in 1963, exactly twenty years ago.

So after persuading my editor to allow me time off to follow up this month's edition, I boarded a National Air-

lines plane and began my journey in search of nineteen nurses.

After arriving in Wilmington, I proceeded to the New Hanover County Medical Center. I was able to follow

up on a good lead by finding some of my former classmates employed there.

To begin with, I collided in the main corridor of the fourth floor female medical service unit with Mrs. Barbara Hardee, the former Barbara Satterwhite. It was to my advantage that we recognized each other before she outleted her hostility my way, what with all the floor's broken thermometers scattered here and there. But instead we hugged each other and exchanged jumbled and confused exclamations. Over a cup of coffee in the employee's main dining area, Bobbie told me about the new brick Early American home she and Ronnie have just finished and their two children, a boy and girl both in high school now.

After a few minutes I was surprised by another member of our class. Mrs. Judy Hudgens, present Assistant Director of Nursing Service here. I must say Judy still possesses the good leadership qualities she had while we were in school. She also has children, three to be exact, with cornflower blue eyes and flaxen hair.

A tap on the shoulder brought me whirling around to come face to face with Eula May King. Eula Mae works in the Intensive Care Unit. On her vacation this coming summer, she has made arrangements to tour Iran. I know that someday she would fulfill her dream. She hasn't changed a bit and she still has her one and only Bolton accent.

After I explained my purpose in coming, Judy, Eula May, and Bobbie told me about the doings of some more

of our classmates.

Linda Stoudenmire Vernon is living in Wilmington doing private duty nursing here in the county at various hospitals and homes.

Jean Keith and Jimmy are living at Ward's Corner now. They have a farm and Jean stays home and takes care

of their six children. She no longer finds time to work as a nurse.

Ruth Strickland is working in Public Health in her hometown of New Bern. She and her twin sister share an apartment and they are both well known in that area for their volunteer church work.

Not too far away over in Morehead City, Mildred Lockhart is a head nurse at the hospital there. I hear that

Gene Jr. finally got his little sister and brother to boot.

Vivian Blanchard and Eric are living in Clinton, where Vivian does general duty in the pediatric ward of Clin-

ton's hospital.

From Wilmington, I travelled to Raleigh to visit Margaret Register, nursing instructor at Dorothea Dix State Hospital. She was offered the position two years ago to fulfill the vacancy left by the late Miss Rachel Westmoreland. After spending the afternoon with Margaret discussing the latest therapeutic techniques in psychiatric nursing, I took a bus over to Chapel Hill to see Alice Groves. I met her as she was getting off duty at Chapel Hill Memorial Hospital. Later at Alice's apartment, which is right off the campus of U. N. C., she still tried to convince me that single life is the best life. She steadily dates college professors, doctors, interns, and other interesting men.

We drove over to Durham to have supper with Sybil Grissett and her husband, who is a doctor and professor at Duke University. Sybil filled me in on how she came to Duke Medical Center to work a couple of years after graduation and met her husband here, where upon they married and have lived ever since.

From Durham I caught the northbound train to Alexandria, Virginia to drop in on Betty Jo and Don Marshall. Pam no longer works, but helps Harry take care of his radio and television retail and repair business. We all had a tremendous dinner with Pam in charge of the cooking, which she has become a wizard at.

Before returning to New York, I took a cross-country jet to California. In Los Angeles I found Carolyn Batten and her husband Chico. Carolyn works at the Los Angeles County Hospital, and she and Chico love living here

where they can attend all the cultural and entertainment activities.

From L. A. I drove north to a small town south of San Francisco to visit Sue and Dave Wylie. In the twenty years since we have graduated, I have visited them several times, so this was a resting place on my journey before I returned home. Sue and Dave have a beautiful Japanese styled house on the cliffs overlooking the Pacific. Dave works in San Francisco, and Sue runs the household. Their children are exact replicas of both of them. So we spent several days together relaxing in the sun reminiscing over school days and how the fates of our classmates had turned out.






