SIR,

I have the honor at the
unanimous instruction of the Garden Committee
to request the provision in
the 1926 budget estimates
of \$ 5250 (say ^{five thousand and 250})
for the erection
of gates at the entrance to
the Botanic Gardens.

The Committee notes that
as a natural consequence of the
long period since the garden
the roadway & make a
provision through the
garden road forms, and con-
sider that it is essential to
the amenities & cannot be
prevented unless means are
taken to clear it. It is
devised of them that if
the gates ^{substance} away from town be

Kept closed since, say, 10 days to
3.30 pm. ~~was~~ and all be closed
as provided by law at least

a real ~~benefit~~ improvement
will result. The alternative to gates
would seem to be ^{a considerable} increase in
the number of the ~~watchmen~~ & employment
of men much more authoritative
than those used now.

3. The proposal I sent Gates is
not new. A WtC ^{for them} existed in the
Estimate for 1924, but was not used:-
