



Their happy times, their quarrels, their compatibility, their disappointments create their bond, symbolized by the taped ring on her left hand.



New techniques in language teaching—the language lab.



Even these familiar groans are encouraging to the LANGUAGE teacher listening through his earphones at the front of the lab. Patiently he repeats the complicated phrase. The class renews its efforts to translate the language to the English idiom. Conjugate verbs; decline nouns; study idiomatic expressions; combine all of these into coherent sentences. As the French tape ends, the student turns the lesson switch to "off," and wearily rises to leave. Regardless of his temporary depression, he will be back tomorrow to try again. Each day he gains a little more understanding of the basic principle of his language and of the country where it originated.


Think; write. Think; discuss. This pattern, followed in JOURNALISM CLASS, teaches students to organize their thoughts into clear, meaningful words, phrases, themes and news stories. Since the class is not rigidly bound to a textbook more time than usual is devoted to discussions, which range from the merits of the latest movies, records, and plays, through the techniques of advertising and propaganda, and even to the pros and cons of censorship.

Walking through the halls during any period, one could hear classes discussing life and its problems in world centers as remote from each other as Moscow, Formosa, Washington, D. C., Havana, and Berlin. These were only a few of the topics covered by the SOCIAL STUDIES CLASSES. Others discussed problems here at home: the nation's economy, the home and family, and the workings of our government. Although the social studies classes vary widely, all have the same primary purpose of helping students learn about the United States and other countries, their problems and their peoples.

Drip, drip. Acid trickles slowly down the tube. Hot and steaming, it swirls through the cold black powder. A moldy green sludge now jumps and bubbles everywhere. From the noxious mass, bubbles swell and burst. Their deadly fumes, an eerie yellow-green, twist and turn through a maze of rubber tubes and jars. Skillful hands maneuver bottles full of gas, replacing them with empty jars. A hand slips; a jar falls to the floor and shatters. Doors fly open and students rush out, coughing and gagging. The CHEMISTRY CLASS has learned that $4HCl+MnO_2\rightarrow MnCl_2+2H_2O+Cl_2$



Light explodes in a myriad of dazzling colors as a prism bends a single white ray into a shimmering rainbow. Students in the darkened room are experimenting with light. Later, a block of wood creeps slowly down an inclined plane, and dull silver weights stretch a copper wire taut. Students frantically copy figures and make graphs, plotting points and drawing lines. PHYSICS CLASS: problems, pulleys, levers, vectors, headaches, and young physicists who enjoy experiments and can take hard work.

Armed with the tool of his trade, a slide rule protruding from a back pocket, the MATHEMATICS student begins his test. He feels confident. The brimming knowledge gained in past years overflows onto his test paper. The lines and angles of geometry, X's and Y's of algebra, the sines and tangents of trig all will profit him in future years. Yes, one day they will help him. But right now problem six has him completely stumped.

In the BUSINESS course classes at Euclid, students learn important details of what their duties in the business world will be. They are taught how to manipulate competently various types of office equipment, from typewriters to duplicating machines, and struggle through the intricacies of shorthand and bookkeeping. These students will leave Euclid knowing they are fully prepared to become efficient office workers.

Mouth-watering aromas filling the halls are the sign that the girls are hard at work in COOKING CLASS, gaining valuable experience that will give them a head start as future homemakers.

Armed with pattern, material, needle and thread, scissors, pins, and tape measure, the **SEWING** student begins her first project. Cut, pin, baste, press, stitch, gossip. While gaining useful skill in tailoring, she creates an attractive and practical wardrobe.

Curbs jump, trees move, and other drivers head for cover as Euclid's **DRIVING** students practice on the streets of Euclid in the driver training cars.

Some students approach their first day in the car confidently; others, apprehensively, but by the end of the course experience has increased their confidence. Of course, mishaps occur during the semester, but every driving student learns the essentials of safe, sportsmanlike driving.

Changing a hobby to workable knowledge.





A wrench probes deep inside the black innards of a greasy car engine. Searching, it finds loose bolts and grips the nut and twists and tightens it. After two periods of hard work the student mechanic turns the key and a motor, long dead and silent, bursts to life and purrs softly. That sound is thrilling for this boy, who feels a touch of mechanical genius in himself. His coveralls are splattered with grease, and a drop of oil trickles down his forehead as he listens to the sound of a healthy motor. AUTO SHOP gives him a chance to do what he does best, and he enjoys it.

"Printers' devils" sit hunched over trays of type. They reach into the tiny compartments and pull out the squares of lead. Slowly, methodically, they set the type in place by hand. At last the job is ready for printing. In another room the Survey rolls from the grinding presses. Ink glistens on great slabs of metal cast in a linotype machine. A sheet of aluminum whirls 'round and 'round on an offset press nearby, leaving a mottled pattern of black on white paper. Here in the **PRINT SHOP** the printers' devils learn the various techniques of the trade.

The whine is high-pitched and deafening; blades are whirring, drill heads boring deep. They attack each piece of wood, ripping and chewing, and spit sawdust and shavings everywhere. There is a raw, white wood smell too, all around, except where shellac and glue send off dark, pungent fumes. Here, to one side, lies a pile of splintery boards, saw-tooth marks in their rough hewn sides. But on the other side stand tables, cabinets, chairs, rough boards transformed to satiny smoothness. These tools have done it, in the hands of a young craftsman of the **WOOD SHOP.**

Students in SWIMMING CLASS listen and obey, or try to obey. During the weeks of concentrated effort and exercise they gradually gain skill and co-ordination. Everyone looks forward to swimming class, which offers a refreshing change from classroom studies. Most welcome is Friday's free swim period when students can practice skills they have learned, and perfect favorite stunts. After a six weeks of well-organized swimming instruction, students show their gratitude by shoving their teachers into the pool.






