## DEDICATION

 D A YEuclid Senior High was formally dedicated on Sunday afternaon, October 30, 1949. A large portion of the populace attended the Dedication and the open house which preceded it. This was the first opportunity Euclid residents had to inspect the completed building to which they had contributed so generously.

Many distinguished guests were present at the impressive ceremony held in the auditorium. Among these were Governor Frank Lausche, who delivered the dedication address, Dr. Clyde Hissong, state superintendent of public instruction, members of the board of education, and civic leaders. At the completion of speeches, Principal Clifford G. Owens was presented flags by Commander Howard Goebel of the American Legion, Post 343.

Following the close of the program, tea was served in the cafeteria by the Euclid Council of Parent-Teachers' Association, where the public was given an opportunity to meet the dignitaries, teachers, and friends.

We, the Euclidian staff of 1950, dedicate this book to the citizens of Euclid. Had it not been for their foresight, public spirit, and deep interest in the youth of this community, our school could not have become a reality.
