


Varsity Football


The Panthers of '75 struggled for the first part of the season with opening losses to Toledo Start, Warren Harding, and rival St. Joseph. These made them work even harder toward achievement of the pinnacle of success which eluded them for another few weeks, until a Homecoming victory spurred them on to capture second place in the new league. Under the first year tutelage of Head Coach Seymour, the Panthers finished the season with a 2-5-2 overall record, 2-3-1 in the Greater Cleveland Conference. Named to the All-League team were flanker Ken Petardi (led league in pass receiving and interceptions), tailback Stan Zupancic (gained 598 yds.), and punter Frank Reily (33yd. avg. punt). Honorable mentions were received by Mark Novosel, Tom Wandersleben, and Steve Pyle.


















Majorettes








A.F.S.






Go Bananas




Astronomy Club

The failure of the school levy after four tries brought further cutbacks in many areas of Euclid Education, and the school board members were forced to act on the impending financial crisis.


Music













500 Miles
