

































To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven:



















































This year the teachers of Euclid Senior High School worked diligently to motivate the learning capacity of the students at Euclid.






























Sports








Varsity Basketball




















Winter Festival 1975




The underclass find themselves constantly in MOTION as they strive to find their niche in a new environment.

Boys' Track


