VALUE OF MONEY.

\$1, or dollar, contains 100 cents, and is equal to four shillings and six pence (British) sterling; or to five francs and thirty centimes of France; or to two and a half guilders of Holland.

92 cents make one shilling sterling.
33 cents are equal to one franc of France.
40 cents are equal to one Dutch guilder.

\$1 is equal to one dollar and ten groschen Saxon currency, or to one and a half dollars Prussian currency.
