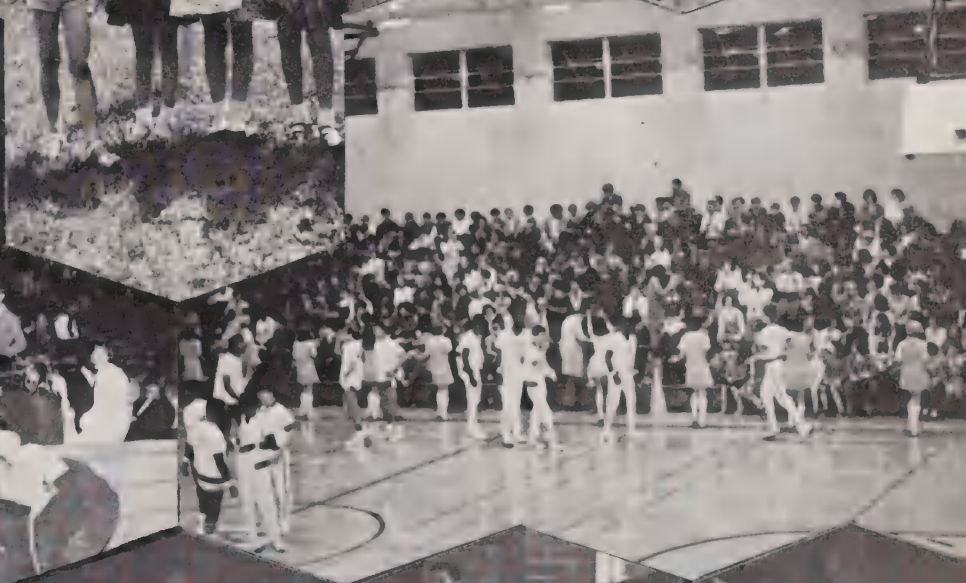




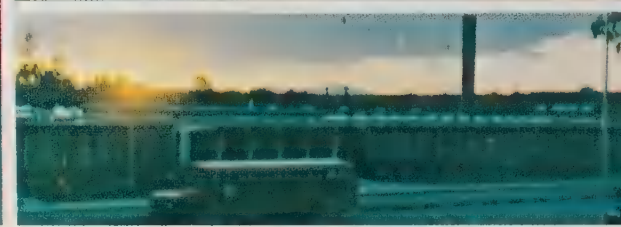


























## *Afterword*
