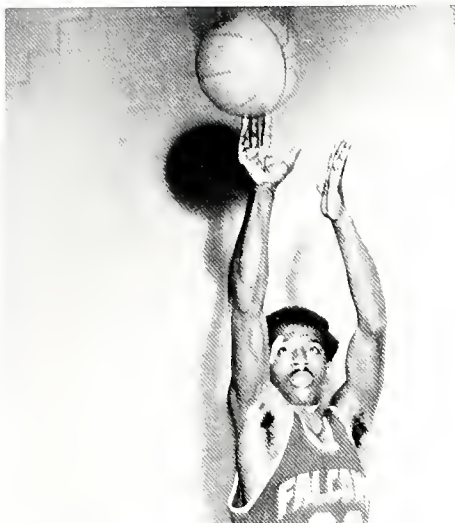

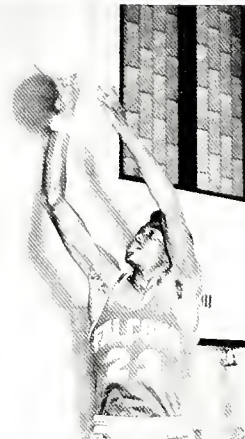

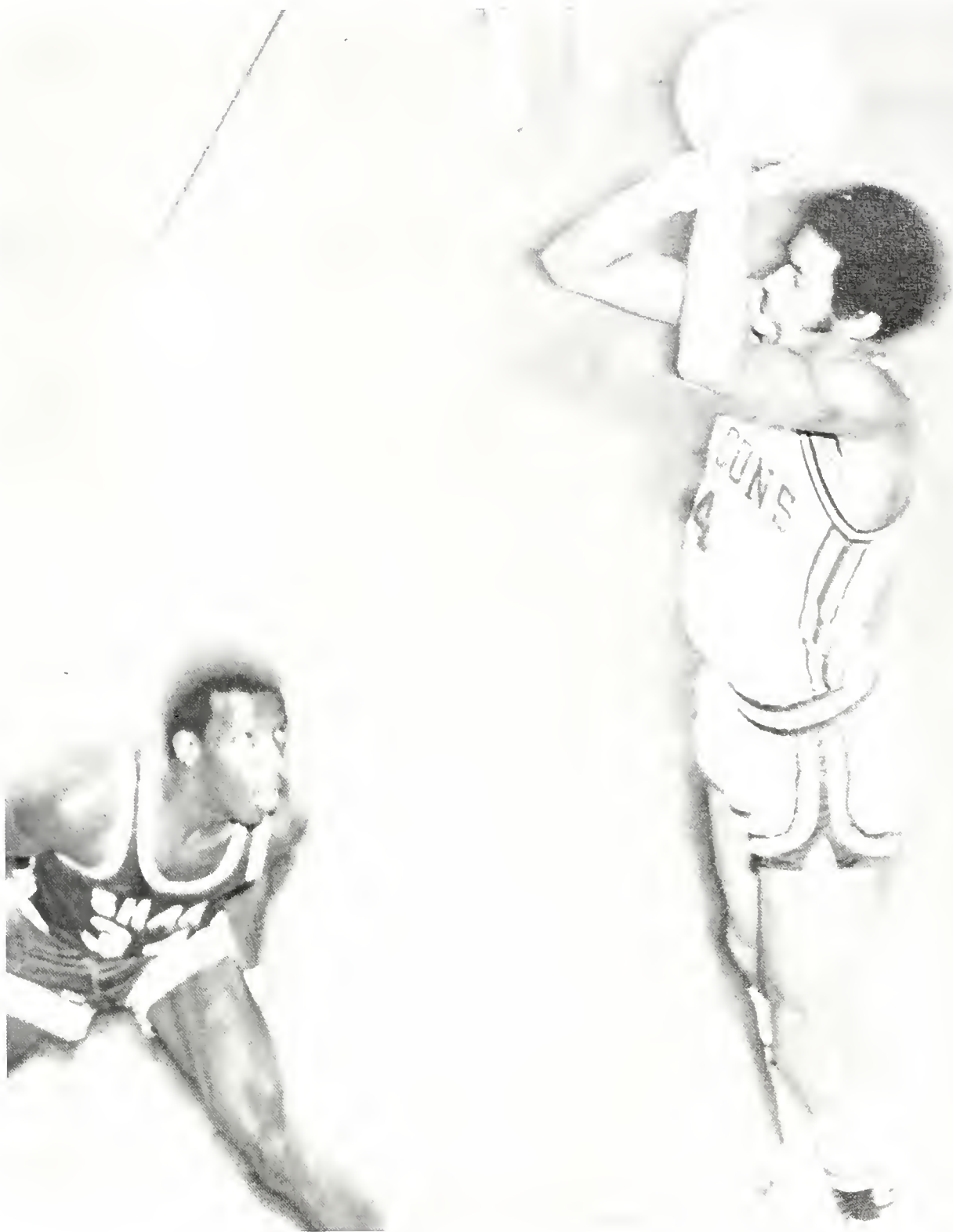

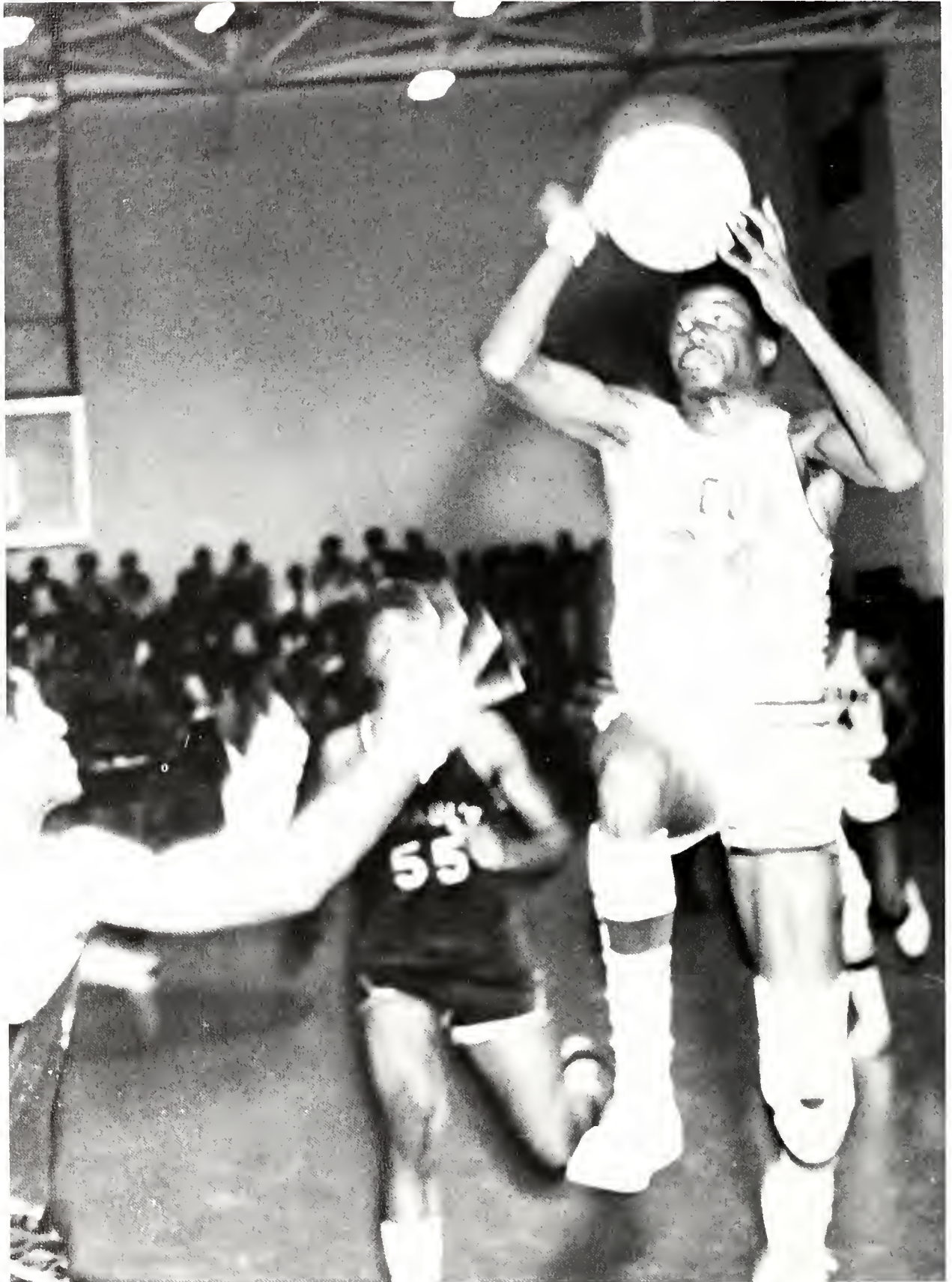

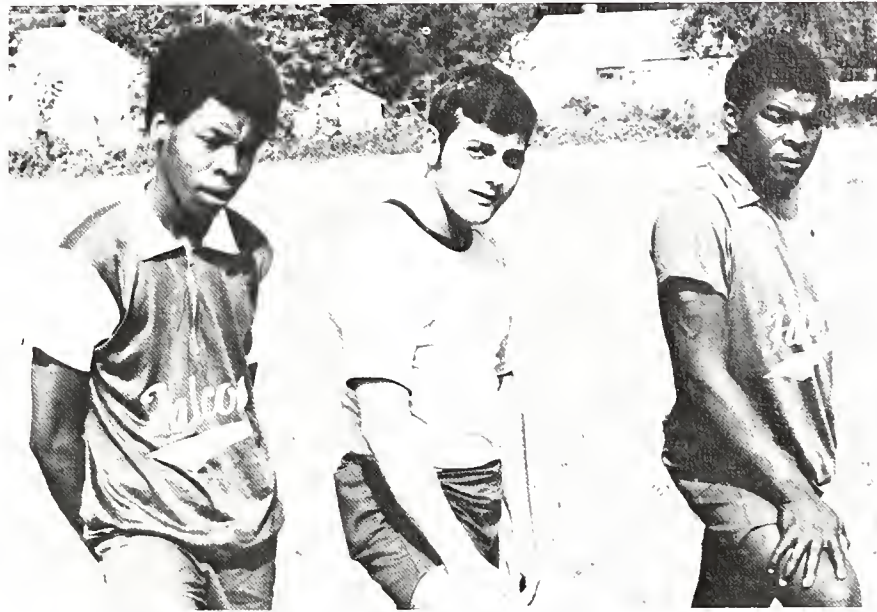

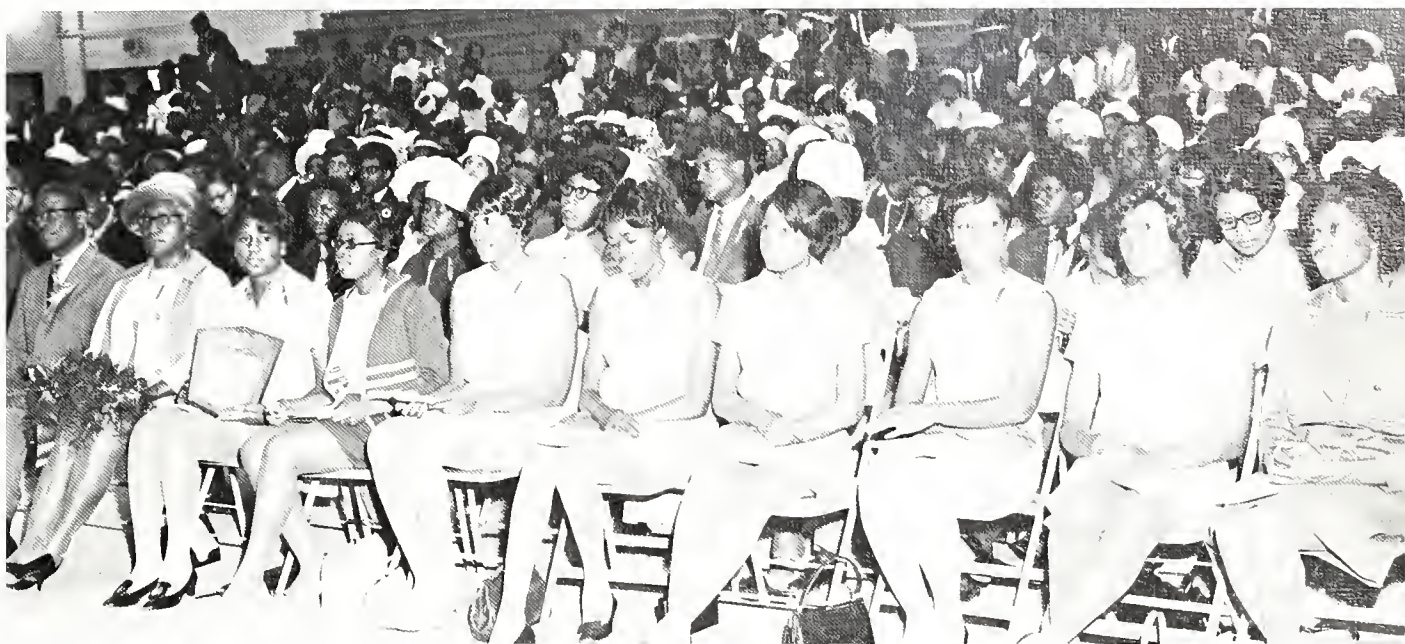

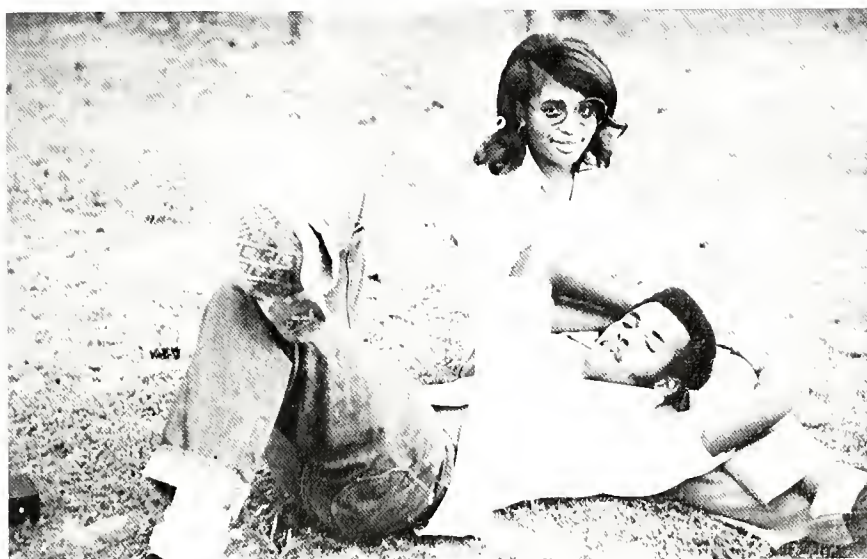

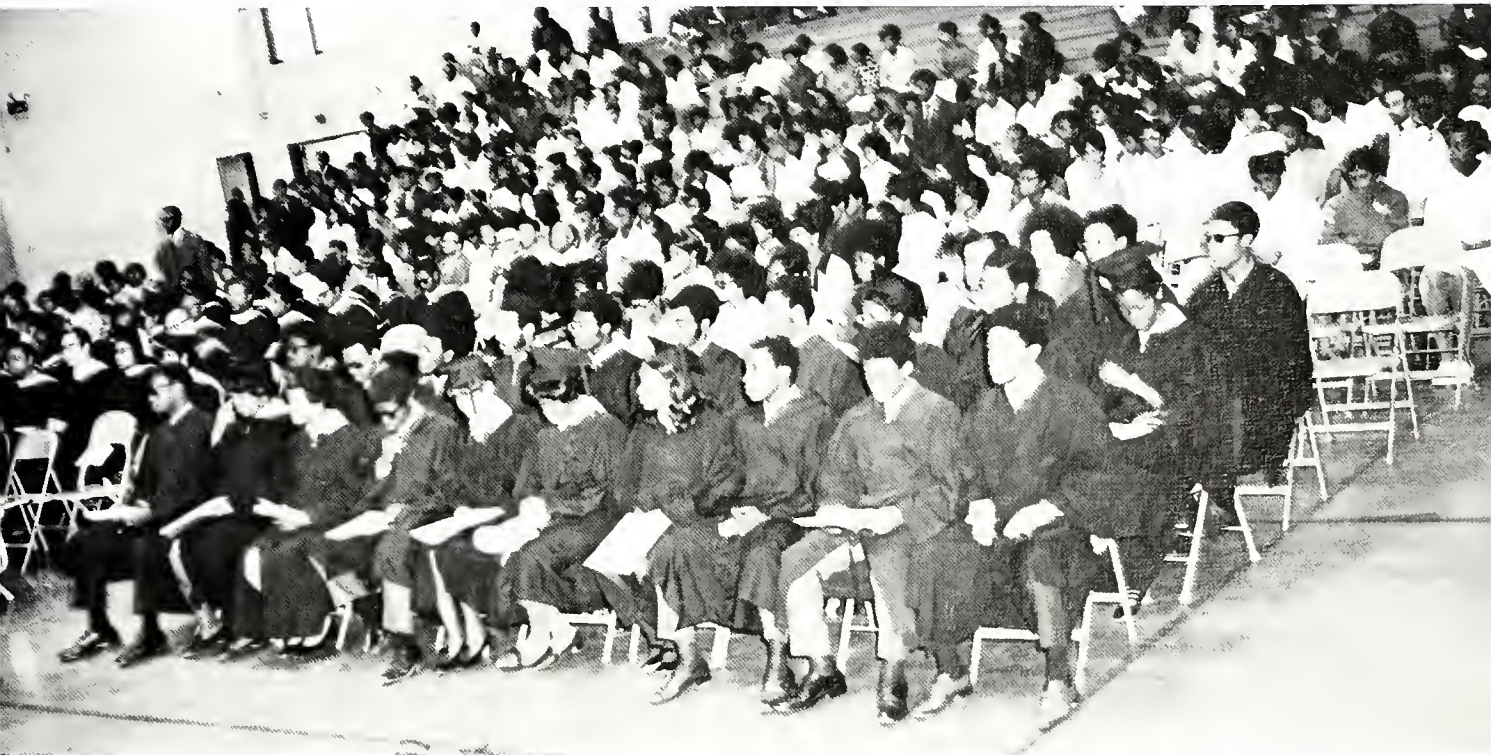

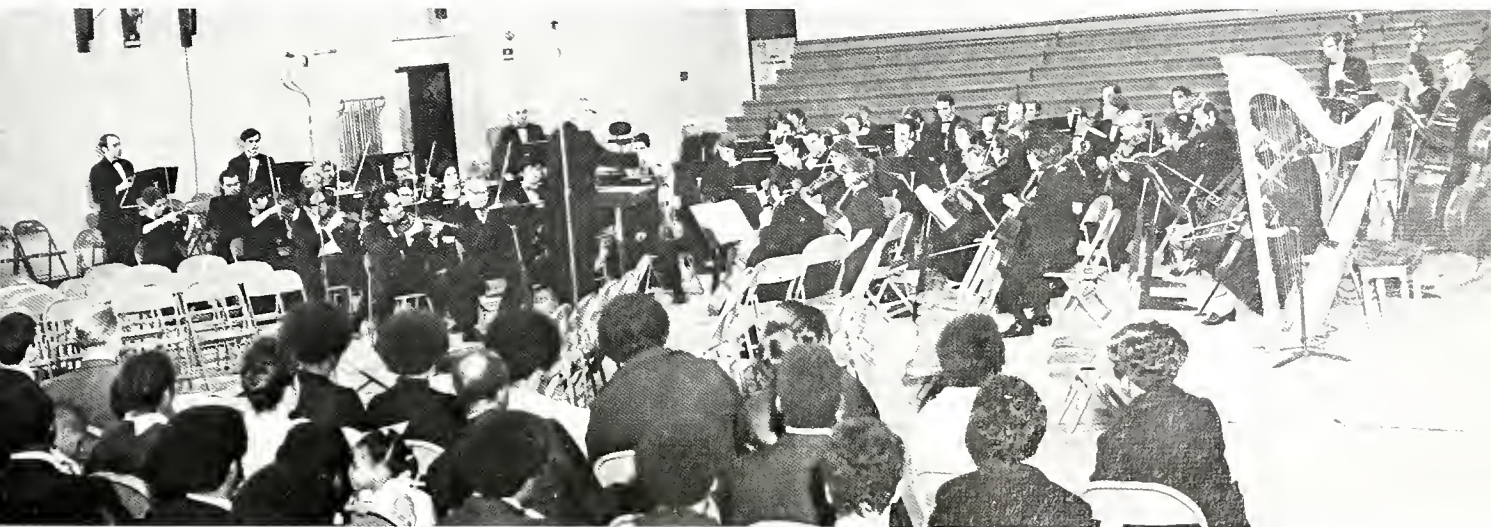

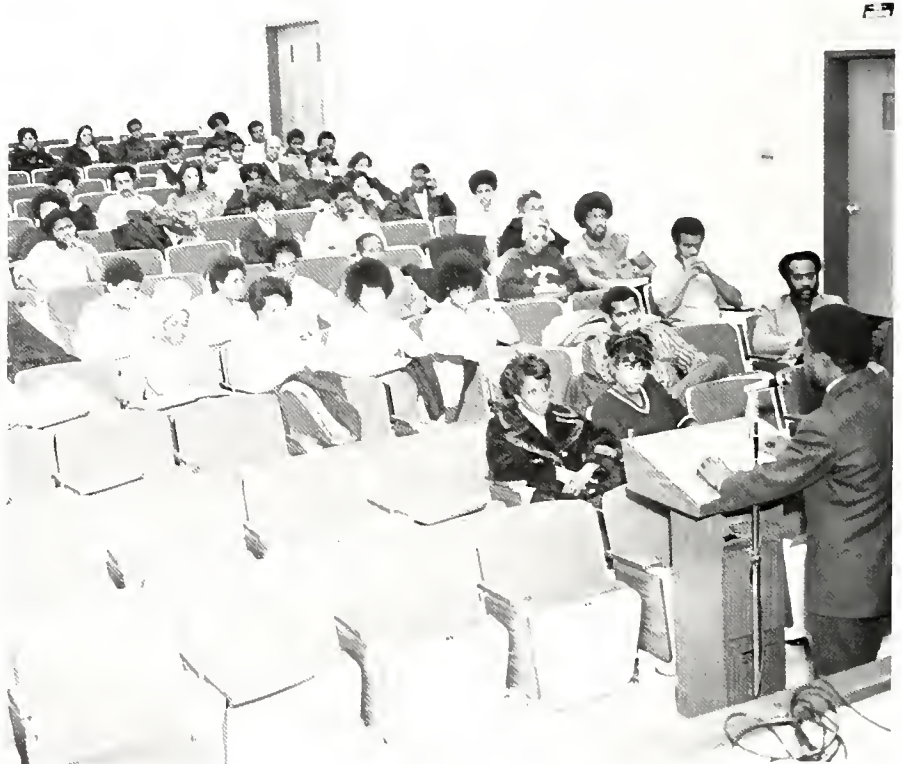

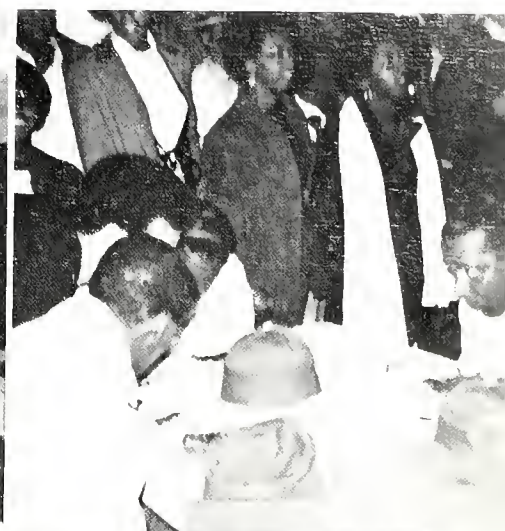
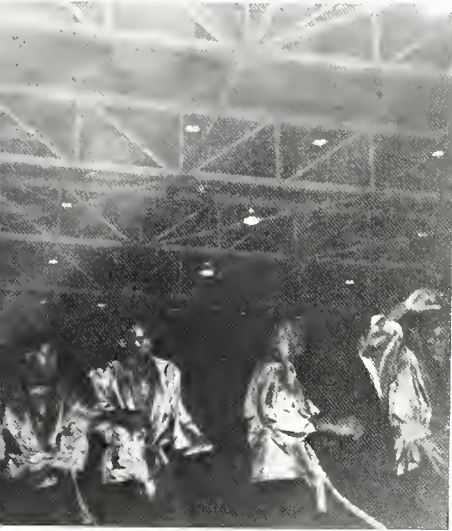
Groove Phi Groove

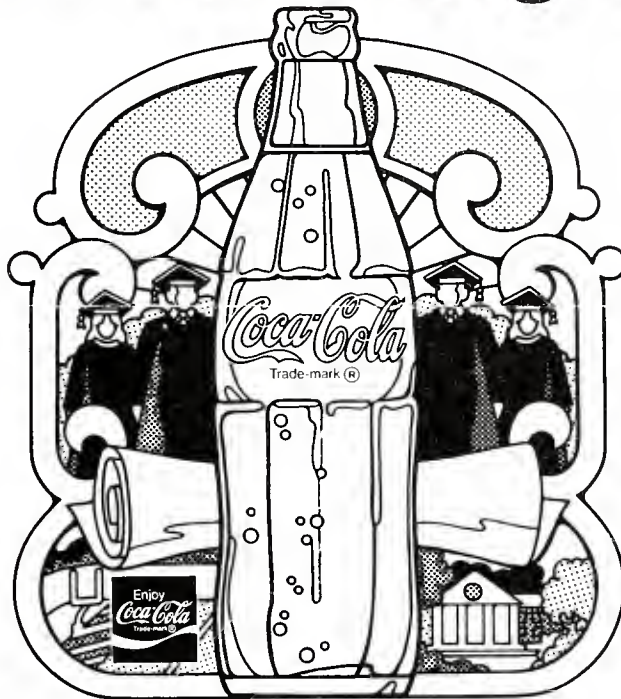

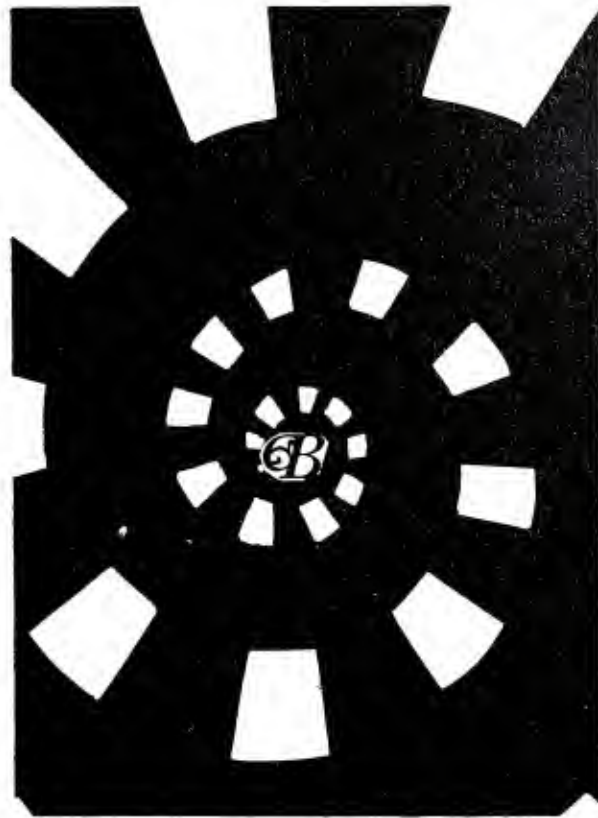
