





Foreword

The Constitutional Convention of Gamma Sigma Sigma Sorority was held at the Beekman Tower in New York City on October 12, 1952. For three days girls at the convention devoted their time devising a national constitution acceptable to all. It was hard work, but those present at the meeting were determined to produce a constitution worthy of the principles of the group.

The purpose of this sorority shall be assemble college and university women in the spirit of service to humanity. 








