DR. FRANK ALEXANDER TOLIVER

Dr. Frank A. Toliver was born in Atlanta, Georgia. He received his early education at the Latin Grammar School, a "feeder" school of the historical Atlanta University and the Bachelor of Arts degree from the same institution, known then as Atlanta College. Early in his life he received a Master of Arts degree in Mathematics from the University of Michigan at Ann Arbor, and the doctorate in Education Administration from Columbia University.

His professional career included long years of distinguished service with the North Carolina State Department of Public Instruction and the Department of Public Instruction for the State of Tennessee. While in Tennessee, Dr. Toliver was Professor of Education at Tennessee State University in Nashville.

In 1970, he joined the faculty at Saint Augustine's College and became Professor of Education and Director of Student Teaching. The late Mrs. Dr. Ann Peace Toliver was also Professor of English and Humanities and Chairperson of the Division of Humanities at Saint Augustine's.
