A TRIBUTE TO LADY FALCONS VOLLEYBALL

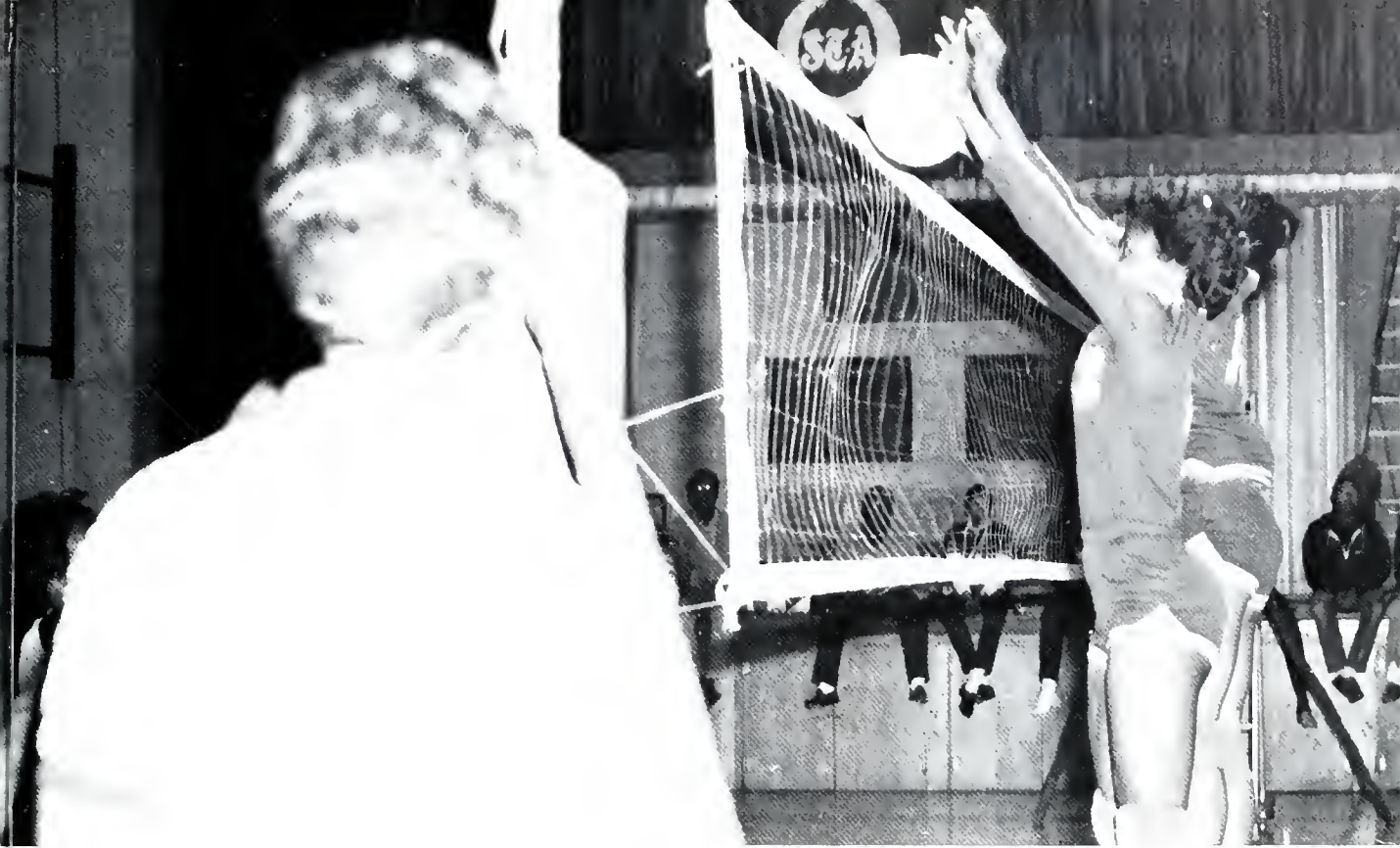
