Hyacinths are perfectly hardy in all parts of the United States and Canada. They come into bloom outdoors at the same time as the midseason Tulips. The bulbs must be planted in the fall to bloom the following spring. In the garden, place them with the base 5 to 6 inches below the soil level. Be sure to plant the bulbs all at the same depth as otherwise they might not flower at the same time. Beside their value for garden display they are exceedingly popular for flowering in the house. For this purpose the Mammoth or the Extra-Large bulbs should be chosen.

Two firm rules to follow in planting are: 1. No fresh manure. 2. "Knuckles up," that is. the tops of the rhizomes (roots) should show just above the surface of the ground when planted. For fertilizer use dried sheep or cow manure or bone meal.

Peonies are one of the loveliest and most sweet-scented of flowers and, at the same time, one of the easiest to grow and care for. Peonies are not particular as to position; they grow in full sun or in partial shade where other flowers do not thrive. In fact, shade tends to make the colors more intense and to prolong the blooming season.

Enrich the soil with cow manure before planting. Do not plant too deep. Only 2 inches of soil should cover the "eyes." When the buds are about to open, give a supplemental feeding of liquid manure or Hyponex.

When ordering, make your selection for different blooming times as noted in descriptions of various varieties.
