INTRODUCTION.

THE different kinds of Fines, the nature of the various documents concerned, and the necessary steps in levying a Fine, are sufficiently explained in the Introduction to volume ii of the Record Series; I do not therefore propose to say anything on those points. But I think that it may be useful to the members of the Society to make some remarks as to the advantages and effect of Fines, and the inferences that the topographer and genealogist may reasonably draw from them.

The definition of a Fine given by Sir Frederick Pollock and the late Professor Maitland in their History of English Law is as follows:—"We may describe it briefly and roughly as being in substance a conveyance of land, and in form a compromise of an action. Sometimes the concord puts an end to real litigation; but in the vast majority of cases the litigation has been begun merely in order that the pretended compromise may be made" (vol. ii, p. 95). The litigation had probably ceased to be real long before the period covered by this volume, and it may be taken as reasonably certain that all the Fines here printed were the outcome of the legal fiction above referred to.

The Fine, like the charter of feoffment, and unlike the modern conveyance, was not in itself a complete conveyance; seisin was necessary to perfect the assurance. A point of considerable importance arises from this fact, namely, that one or other of the parties must have been in seisin prior to the Fine, though it is impossible in many cases to say which, more particularly in the cases of settlements (see below). In cases of release, the party to whom the property is released was probably always in seisin; and when the tenendum was to one party and his heirs, without any release, the other party was probably in seisin. In settlements it was not actually necessary to grant to the feoffees and put them in seisin, though this was frequently done, and later on almost invariably;

it was sufficient for the settlor to "recognise" or allege a grant to the feoffee, which the rule of estoppel prevented him from

afterwards denying.

The special advantages of the Fine were of considerable importance. The transaction was placed on record, and an official document could thus be referred to if the parts handed to the parties were lost or destroyed. There was a special writ, quod teneat ei finem factum, which could be used in cases of infringement; this in itself was of great benefit. Conveyances by married women were more readily done by Fine than in any other way, and as married women were examined by the justices in court to make sure that there was no misunderstanding or coercion, titles derived from such a source were thus protected.

I now proceed to consider the various causes for which a Fine was levied, how the different classes may be recognised, and what inferences may fairly be drawn from the formulae of each class. The important points to look at are the tenendum,—the clause beginning with the words "to hold," which shows the position of the parties on the completion of the transaction—and the warranty, which in most cases shows who was the actual conveying party.

Fines may, for the most part, be divided into three classes, namely: (1) Feofiments; (2) Releases; and (3) Settlements.

FEOFEMENTS.

I use this word here as meaning an assignment of land or any interest in land to a stranger, either for a money payment or any other consideration. Wherever the *tenendum* is to A B and his heirs simply, a simple conveyance or feoffment is shown. Thus, No. 2, p. I, may be taken to be a purchase by Robert de Smalshagh from Robert Chopard and his wife, and the conveyance is taken (as it would be to-day) to the purchaser and his heirs. We look at the warranty, and we see that it is against the heirs of the wife; it is therefore a case of a married woman and her husband joining in the sale of the wife's land. No. 5, p. 2, gives us two variations: the purchaser is a married man, and he wishes his wife to have a life interest in the purchased property. He therefore takes the *tenendum* to himself and his wife and his own heirs,

which gives the wife a life estate. The vendor is also a married man, selling his own property, not his wife's; he and his wife therefore warrant against themselves and the heirs of the husband, the wife's warranty being to bar her dower.

Where a married man was transferring his own property, it was necessary to join the wife as a party in order to release her right to dower. Where in such a case the warranty is expressly against the heirs of the husband, there is no doubt that the property belonged to him. Where there is no warranty at all and no indication elsewhere, the matter is not so clear, but in all such cases, and there are a good many of them, it is most likely that the property was the husband's. Had the property been the wife's, the necessity for the warranty would have been much greater, because the law jealously safeguarded the real estate of a married woman; a special writ, known as the "Writ of cui in vita," was frequently used to upset sales made during coverture, if, after the husband's death, the wife could show that she had been ignorant of what was done or had been coerced in any way.

Where the transferor is not mentioned as having a wife, he was in all probability either a bachelor or a widower; for if he had a wife, she would be a necessary party. There may have been exceptions due to carelessness or ignorance on the part of the lawyers, but it may be safely taken as a sound general rule.

No such inference can be made in the case of the transferee; there was no obligation on him, if married, to take any estate to his wife unless he chose. If he did not choose to do so, she would have her dower in one-third. If he wished to give her more, the *tenendum* would run: to the husband and wife and the heirs of the husband, which would give the wife a life estate in the whole after the husband's death.

Where the property belonged to the wife, there is generally a warranty against her heirs, and the presence of such a warranty is conclusive evidence of the fact. The absence of such a warranty, however, is not conclusive that the property belonged to the husband, for the contrary may appear elsewhere in the Fine. For example, p. 2, No. 9, where the reversion after an outstanding dower is said to belong to the wife. No. 8, p. 7, is another example.

Where two or more persons are joint transferors, it may be taken that they are probably joint tenants, and in most cases it will be found that such joint transferors are women, married or single. Whenever this occurs, a strong probability arises that they were coheiresses, holding jointly property which had descended to them in the absence of male heirs; they would therefore be either sisters or descendants of sisters, it is generally impossible to say which.

A good case is that of No. 6, p. 21, where three married coheiresses and their respective husbands concur in the conveyance of an advowson.

No. 59, p. 176, appears to be a case of three coheiresses, all married, whose husbands join in the Fine.

No. 26, p. 183, is probably another case of three coheiresses, two of whom are married; the description of the third, as "daughter of John de Scotton," no doubt gives the parentage of the other two.

No. 39, p. 185, is a similar case, but the unmarried coheiress is sister of one of the other two. This must not be understood as implying that the first one was not also a sister, for the practice was generally to describe collateral relationship by reference to the last named person.

No. 3, p. 48, is clearly a case of coparceners, but it is impossible to make out the exact relationship between the three ladies; they represent either two or three sisters; Margaret and Florence were probably the daughters of two sisters, and Katherine may have been sister of one of them, or possibly aunt to both.

No. 7, p. 147, is suggestive of two brothers having married two sisters.

RELEASES.

The releases are more difficult to understand than the feoffments, because from their very nature there is implied the existence of other interests, the nature of which is not disclosed. The proper words are "release" or "quitclaim," and there may or may not be a warranty. The special point to remember is that the person to whom the release is made is (or ought to be) then actually in seisin of the property. Thus, if A buys property from B and has livery of seisin, and then wishes to get in some outstanding interest or claim

that C has, the proper way to do this is for C to release to A. It made no difference whether C's interest was big or little; it might be a charge, a claim in reversion or remainder, or it might be the fee itself after a short outstanding term of years. Once A was in seisin, however small his interest, any other interest, however large, would pass by a release. As a general rule, no indication is given of the nature of the interest released, and the practice was to release the whole property, however small the interest of the releasor. Probably the bulk of them represent remainders or reversions, and this is a clue always worth following up. A considerable number also are doubtless life estates of married women in respect of the property of former husbands. This life estate, arising by grant, must not be confused with dower; where dower was to be released it is sometimes specifically mentioned, e.g. No. 54, p. 131.

In many cases the interest released can be seen with absolute certainty. A good example of this is No. 71, p. 75; the widow of a Halnathby, together with her second husband, John de Laton, and Acrisius her son (the Acrisius de Halnathby of No. 72) are deforciants, John de Halnathby being plaintiff; Laton and Maude release for themselves and the heirs of Maude, while Acrisius warrants for himself and his heirs; Maude clearly had a life estate or dower in the property, while Acrisius had some interest in remainder expectant on his mother's death.

Where two persons held as tenants in common, that is, where each was seised of an undivided moiety and not both jointly seised of the whole (joint tenancy), releases were not applicable. No. 36, p. 28, seems to be such a case. Alice wife of

No. 36, p. 28, seems to be such a case. Alice wife of Thomas le Porter was probably sister of Thomas de Silkston, and tenant in common with him of the messuage.

Where a husband and wife are dealing with the wife's property, both release and warranty are sometimes found, as in No. 16, p. 4. Such cases are not so clear as when only release or only warranty occur. They probably deal with mixed titles. In the case cited, for instance, Lucy Fanacourt may have had a fee-simple as to part and dower, or a life estate, in another part; she and her husband would warrant the fee-simple and release the dower or life estate.

A large number of cases are probably releases of her dower by a widow, generally with a second husband joining, for a married woman would not dispose of any rights without her husband's consent; No. 6, p. 2, is a simple instance of this.

SETTLEMENTS.

By the term settlement is meant any case where the *tenendum* is not to "heirs" simply; it may be to "heirs of the body" without further limitation, or it may be to a number of named persons in succession. These are of great importance to the genealogist.

The simplest case is a settlement on a man and the heirs of his body, which is usually followed by a remainder to his "right heirs." This means that, on the failure of descendants, the collateral heirs are to take.

Settlements naturally show a very large variety of forms, but most of them can be classified. Thus, we can in many cases recognise the ante-nuptial, the post-nuptial, and those which do not appear to have been immediately concerned with a marriage. Let us consider some of these in detail.

Ante-nuptial settlements may be by the bridegroom or bride or by the parents or near relatives of either party. The latter variety is the more frequent, and, in many cases, can be deduced with absolute certainty. Wherever we find a *tenendum* to a man and a woman, not described as husband and wife, and the heirs of their bodies, there is certainly an ante-nuptial settlement.

No. 55, p. 47, is a case of ante-nuptial settlement made in contemplation of the marriage of John atte See the younger with Margery Sheffield. It will be noticed that there are two Johns sons of Peter; this is probably an example of the practice of giving two brothers the same Christian name. Some pedigree-makers seem to think that one or other of such sons must have been illegitimate, but there is not the slightest reason for this supposition. The practice was by no means uncommon, however inconvenient it must have been at times.¹

No. 12, p. 50, is another case of ante-nuptial settlement.

¹ Since the above was written I have come across an interesting example among the charters belonging to the Dean and Chapter of Wells. A fifteenth century canon, John Wareyn by name, had a brother, also named John Wareyn, and this brother had two sons, both named John Wareyn.

No. 35, p. 113, is an ante-nuptial settlement by John de Sutton the elder, possibly a widower, on his son John and his intended wife, Alina de Well, and the heirs of their bodies; as the father reserved a life estate to himself, it had to be done through feoffees.

No. 41, p. 114, is a similar case. A life estate is reserved to Walter Frost, the settlor, and his wife, and a second remainder is given to a younger son.

No. 43, p. 115, is another settlement by Walter Frost, on all fours with the preceding except that Walter's wife is not mentioned. These two show that the non-mention of the settlor's wife is not conclusive that no wife was living.

Post-nuptial settlements may generally be inferred from a tenendum to a married son or daughter in special tail, where no children of the marriage are named in remainder. The cases probably indicate that the settlement is made shortly after the marriage and before the birth of any children. No. 1, p. 1, is such a case, and suggests that William de Ayton was recently married. This view is confirmed by No. 10, p. 3, where William settles property on himself and his wife in special tail. William p. 4, is a similar case, and was probably made on the marriage of Henry Vavasour the son.

No. 58, p. 16, is probably a settlement made shortly after the son's marriage, reserving a life estate to the father and his wife.

Another example of settlement on a son's marriage is No. II, p. 7. Here William son of William de Otley is clearly the son of William son of Paulin, though the fact is not stated. No children of William the younger are mentioned, and the settlement is on him and Margaret his wife in special tail. A nominal rent is reserved to William son of Paulin and Constance his wife, evidently the bridegroom's parents, and the reversion to the heirs of Constance shows that the property belonged to her.

Marriage settlements by the wife's relatives may often be inferred, which afford valuable clues to the wife's family. In No. 23, p. 5, for instance, John de Kirketon settles property on Roger de Leeds and Margaret his wife in special tail, to hold of himself at a nominal rent, and with the reversion to himself in fee. Here in all probability John was Margaret's father, brother, or other near relative, and the rent and the reversion show that the property was his.

No. 55, p. 16, is probably a settlement by the wife's father or near relative, made shortly after the marriage and before the birth of any children, reserving a reversion to the grantor, but no life estate.

No. 13, p. 8, is not so clear. It appears to be made on the occasion of the son's marriage, but suggests that he was buying out his father, rather than a settlement by the father.

Where the *tenendum* is to the settlor in special tail, we may infer that it was done shortly after his or her own marriage. Thus, in No. 8, p. 2, if John Marmyon and his wife had issue at the date of the Fine, we should reasonably expect them to be named; the fact that none are mentioned gives rise to a strong inference that there were none. In such cases, however, the possibility must not be lost sight of that the marriage may have been a second one; in that event, we should not expect the children of a first marriage to be inserted as a matter of course, a remainder to the settlor's right heirs would be sufficient to bring them in on the failure of the issue of the special tail.

No. 59, p. 16, is probably a settlement made by William le Vavasour, immediately after his own marriage and before the birth of any children.

Occasionally a marriage settlement deals with property of both husband and wife. In No. 41, p. 56, the husband's property was limited to himself in fee, while the wife's property was settled on herself and her husband in special tail, with remainder to her own right heirs.

No. 29, p. 140, is another example of husband and wife both settling property. The joint properties are first of all settled on the husband and wife m special tail; then the husband's property is settled on himself in tail general, with remainder to his right heirs; next the wife's property is settled on herself in tail general, and then on the husband in tail general, and finally a remainder to the wife's right heirs. The fact that the wife settles her property, in default of her own issue, on her husband's issue by any other wife, in preference to her own family, creates a strong inference that she was an only child with no near relations.

Where a number of estates tail are given in succession to named children, it may generally be taken for granted that the whole of the family is mentioned, with the possible exception of priests, monks, nuns, and the like. Thus, in No. 23, p. 10, the four named sons and the four named daughters of Thomas Racyn no doubt constituted the whole of his family; and, as no wife is mentioned, we may infer that Thomas was a widower at the time.

But where two generations are named, it cannot be taken as exhaustive for the first, though it probably is so as to the second. In No. 24, p. 10, for instance, the relation of Richard de Navilton to John is not stated; the remainder to Richard's son probably indicates that there was only one.

No. 47, p. 45, is a good example of what may be deduced as to the state of a man's family. Robert de Langthwaite settles property on himself and Joan his wife in special tail male, with remainder to his daughter Joan in tail. If Joan the wife was the mother of Joan the daughter, which seems probable, then Robert clearly had no son, but his wife was young enough to make it possible that she might yet bear a son, but in default of this the only daughter is to take.

Settlements on a son for life only probably indicate a younger son, the father wishes to make provision for him without permanently diminishing the family estate; e.g. No. 16, p. 24, where a nominal rent of a rose was reserved.

No. 39, p. 143, is probably another case of provision for younger sons. Sir Thomas de Gasteneys settled property on two sons, John and Thomas, for life, with remainder to another son William in tail; William was probably the eldest son.

Settlements on unmarried daughters are rare; No. 16, p. 8, is an example. The settlement is on the daughter and the heirs of her body, paying a nominal rent to the parents; the property belonged to the mother.

No. 35, p. 27, appears to be another case of settlement on a daughter. Joan was probably Alice's mother, widow of William Gylmyn, and Michael was probably her second husband.

No. 13, p. 97, is probably a settlement on married daughters.

Nicholas de Sutton, apparently a widower, settles land on himself in tail male, then to John de Brayton and Elizabeth his wife in tail, then to John le Botiller and Joan his wife in tail, and, in default, to his own right heirs. Though no relationship is stated between Nicholas and the two married ladies, the suggestion that they were in fact his daughters is probably correct.

A settlement on daughters only must not be taken as showing that there were no sons, though it is often the fact. Take the Ros settlement, for instance, No. 24, p. 5. William de Ros settles Helmsley Castle and other property on himself and the heirs of his body, then gives a life estate to his wife, followed by estates in tail male on his two daughters, Margaret and Elizabeth, successively, with remainder to his own right heirs. The property included the *caput* of the barony, and it seems clear that William at time (November, 1327) had no son, or he would certainly have been named. William eventually had two sons, William and Thomas, the elder of whom, William, is said to have been born in 1326. This Fine seems to show clearly that he was not born till later.

But where a remainder, after an estate tail to a daughter, is given to a person of a different name, a strong probability arises that there were no sons. Thus, in No. 60, pp. 16, 17, Alice and Margaret were probably the only children of Geoffrey de Eston; William de Aldwark was very likely a near relation, such as a nephew.

No. II, p. 147, appears to be another case of settlement on a daughter first. Alice, Thomas de Barwick's wife, was in all probability Robert de Bradley's daughter; she and her husband have a life estate, and then Robert's three named sons have estates in tail male.

But where sons only are included, it does not follow that there were no daughters. Thus, in No. 45, p. 14, the three named sons of Edmund Wasteney were probably all he had at that time, but there may have been daughters, though none are named.

Sometimes we find a settlement on a daughter which, with the subsequent remainders, throws much light on the pedigree. In No. 31, p. 126, it is probable that Elizabeth wife of Robert de Bolling was the only child of Roger de Thornton, the settlor, and the persons in remainder are doubtless the settlor's brothers and sister. Adam de Savill may have been a nephew or other near relative.

No. 14, p. 97, is instructive. Mariota wife of Nicholas de Hornington settles property on herself and her husband in tail, then to three named sisters in tail, then to a brother in tail, then to Nicholas de Appleby (whose relationship does not appear)

in fee. The inferences to be drawn are that Nicholas and Mariota had no children, and that the brother and sisters were unmarried.

Some of the cases are decidedly puzzling. Take No. 17, p. 24, for instance. The relationship between the parties is not easy to disentangle at first sight. As a working hypothesis, I suspect that Adam and Agnes were the grandparents of John son of Nicholas, Nicholas being dead, leaving a widow Isabel, who had dower in the inheritance of Agnes. It is this last fact which is difficult to account for, but if Nicholas were the son (and probably heir) of Agnes, the rest works out clearly enough.

Outstanding estates in dower should always be carefully studied, as they give most valuable clues.

Examples: No. 9, p. 2.—Elizabeth widow of John de Hamerton was probably mother of Constance de Ilkton.

No. 8. p. 7, and No. 1, p. 91.—Isabel wife of Brian Burdon was probably the mother of Joan de la River, married to a second husband.

Another case of probable settlement on a grandson is No. 21, p. 25. It looks as though William Tortemeyn's daughter had married Robert de Newton, and had a son, Walter, who had just married Maude. William accordingly settles property on his daughter (?) and her husband for life, at a nominal rent of a rose, and then on his grandson (?) and his wife in special tail, with reversion to himself and his heirs.

Another case which looks like a settlement on grandchildren is No. 52, p. 46. Isabel de Grey and Oliva are probably daughters of Robert de Saxton; Isabel has three sons and two daughters; Oliva is probably unmarried.

A good example of side-light on pedigrees is shown by No. 18, p. 9. Agnes, the wife of Thomas de Sheffield, was one of the daughters and coheirs of Brian FitzAlan; her first husband was Sir Gilbert de Stapleton, who died in 1320 or 1321, and the Brian de Stapleton mentioned in the Fine was the second son of this marriage. John and William de Sheffield were no doubt issue of the second marriage.

No. 13, p. 23, looks like a combined purchase and settlement; Nicholas de Langton apparently buys from Richard L'orfevre and takes his conveyance in the form of a settlement on himself for life and his newly-married son in special tail.

The absence of a wife's name is not conclusive that the party was a bachelor or a widower. Nos. 41 and 43, pp. 114, 115, make this clear. Walter Frost was settling three messuages on a son who was about to marry; he reserved a life estate in one messuage to himself and his wife, and in the other two to himself only; the wife is therefore mentioned in No. 41, but not in No. 43.

Nos. 23 and 24, p. 150, is somewhat similar; by No. 23 property is settled on husband and wife in special tail; by No. 24 other property is settled on the husband in tail general, and the wife is not mentioned.

No. 23, p. 110, strongly suggests that Emma wife of John de Silkston was the sister of John de Codington, and that she had a limited interest in John's property. This is shown by the fact that Emma and John join in the release, but John's heirs alone are mentioned in the warranty.

No. 9, p. 135, is a good example of how property could be settled in various ways by the same Fine. Nicholas de Stapleton divides his estates into three portions, which are settled on Nicholas himself for life; in the first portion the remainder is to his son Miles and Isabel his wife in special tail; in the second portion the remainder is to Miles and Isabel and the heirs of the body of Miles, that is, in tail general; in the third portion it is to Miles alone in tail general. By No. 11, p. 136, and No. 25, p. 139, Miles and Isabel are put in immediate possession of other property, without any life estate to Nicholas.

Another example of a complicated form of settlement is No. 62, p. 17. Robert de Stuteville senior conveys the whole estate to Robert junior, reserving a life estate to himself and his wife in the whole, and life estates in named portions to his three daughters.

No. 43, p. 44, is rather puzzling. John le Botiller settles property on himself and Agnes his wife in special tail, with remainders to his daughters, Isabel and Margaret, in tail. It suggests that Isabel and Margaret were the issue of a previous marriage, and that Agnes was John's second wife. No. 50, p. 46, is a similar case, where John de Barton, having two sons and a daughter, appears to be making provision for a possible family by a second wife.

A life estate only may be created by Fine, but such cases do not often occur, except in the case of younger sons. An

example will be found in No. 6, p. 6, where Geoffrey le Scrope gives a life estate to Geoffrey de Upsal, to hold of himself at a nominal rent. No. 14, p. 8, is another case of life estate, given to a man and his wife, with a nominal rent reserved to the grantor.

Wherever a settlement is made by one or more clerics or by two or more persons having a cleric or clerics among them, it is highly probable that the first tenant for life or in tail had conveyed the property to the actual settlor or settlors for the express purpose of making the settlement. Thus in the Ayton case, No. 1, p. 1, and the Marmion case, No. 8, p. 2, it may be taken for granted that Gilbert de Ayton and John Marmion had conveyed their properties to the parsons, as feoffees or trustees, to settle the same according to given directions. The reason for this was that under the then existing law a man could not convey property to himself; he must first convey to someone else, who then reconveys it as may be desired.

No. 13, p. 97.—The property belongs to Nicholas de Sutton; the deforciants are feoffees; Elizabeth de Brayton and Joan le Botiller are probably two married daughters; apparently Nicholas has no wife living; if he has a son, which is doubtful, this is probably an independent provision for the daughters.

No. 20, p. 99.—The deforciants are feoffees; the property is Sir John Moryn's; apparently he is a widower; the two named sons are probably the only two.

No. 24, p. 100.—This is rather out of the common form. It suggests that there has been a previous settlement on Richard de Aldborough the elder and Joan his wife and Richard the son, otherwise it is difficult to see why the wife and the son should be joined as querents. The previous interests appear to be confirmed, and estates tail given in succession to three younger sons.

No. 37, p. 104.—In this case the deforciant is probably a feoffee, notwithstanding his name, inasmuch as the remainder is to the heirs of Patrick de Langdale. The fact that no children are named suggests that it was made shortly after marriage.

Where feoffees were necessarily interposed in order to effect a settlement the usual practice was to convey to them first by an ordinary charter of feoffment, and then to levy a Fine setting out the limitations of the settlement. But sometimes the process was reversed, the conveyance to the feoffees was effected by a Fine, and the settlement followed by a charter. No. 19, p. 51, is evidently such a case, where Adam de Woodhouse is conveying to two clerical feoffees.

In many cases of settlement a tenure is created between the parties, and a nominal rent reserved. This is generally a rose at the Nativity of St. John Baptist, June 24, but some instances of a small pecuniary rent also occur.

Some Miscellaneous Matters.

Tenancy "by the courtesy" or "by the law of England" sometimes occurs. This was a life estate which a husband had in his wife's lands when there had been issue of the marriage capable of inheriting, whether such issue did in fact inherit or not. In No. 54, p. 32, Thomas de Popleton was a widower, who had such issue by his wife, and Thomas Aldreth was either the wife's heir or the assignee of the wife's heir. The transaction was apparently a sale.

Another point of some importance to the genealogist is the presence of guardians, which may be taken as showing that the person so protected was a minor.

The presence of an attorney, on the other hand, merely shows that the party so represented was unable to be present, and had therefore appointed an agent by power of attorney; this could not be done by a minor. The agent is frequently described as "put in the place of" his principal.

Lands held in chief could not be alienated without the royal license. The expression that a Fine was made *per preceptum Regis* probably does not mean more than that such license had been obtained.

Where from any cause a Fine could not be completed at once it is dated in two terms, of which there are many examples. Sometimes a considerable interval elapsed between the two terms, and one or both of the original parties had died. Such cases are valuable as showing the heir of the deceased party, who was bound to complete the Fine commenced by his ancestor. The exact relationship is not always stated, and the irritating word consanguineus, kinsman, is generally used for all degrees more remote than son and daughter, brother and sister. Thus, in No. 7, p. 21, William son of William de Bordesden is

stated to be kinsman and heir of John de Bordesden, but there is no indication if he were grandson, brother, nephew, or even more remote. Such cases require careful study owing to the fact that the Fine is always completed according to the original compact, and the subsequent devolutions are ignored.

The claims that frequently occur do not, as a rule, afford the slightest clue as to their nature, and no safe general deductions can be made from them. Probably in most cases they were derived through some previous settlement on daughters, and this line of investigation will often solve the problem. A good illustration of this is shown in No. 40, p. 56, where seven people put in claims, two of them were Uckerbys and two were descendants of Uckerbys; two of the others were married women, and the seventh was the sister of one of these. The inference is very strong that all these persons were claiming under some earlier Uckerby settlement.

In No. 73, p. 20, is a curious case of father and son bearing different surnames. In the late 12th and early 13th centuries it was not uncommon for a son to take the name of a property which he acquired, so that his name might differ from his father's or brothers'; but it is exceptional so late as 1329, and the bare fact recorded does not afford any explanation. The fact that property belonged to Richard de Berningham shown by the remainder to his right heirs), and that Thomas de Applegarth's son was called Stephen de Berningham, suggests a possibility that Stephen was Richard's nephew, the son of a sister who had married Applegarth. No. 20, p. 164, is another example of change of name, where a son appears to have taken his mother's name.

I venture to hope that these few hints will prove helpful to the reader, and show that Feet of Fines are by no means so dull and uninteresting as they may appear at first sight.

Note.—The remaining numbers in this file (74 to 79), the whole of File 110 (numbers 1 to 49), the whole of File 111 (numbers 1 to 46), and the greater part of File 112 (numbers 1 to 38), have at some time formed one file. They are much injured by damp, many of them being mere fragments. The missing details are here supplied, so far as possible, from two other sources, namely, the Notes of Fines and the payments for licences of concord entered on the De Banco Rolls. The Notes are incomplete as a series; they are under arrangement, so that it is impossible to give more than a reference to the bundle in which they are at present comprised. Where a Note exists, it contains practically all the information to be found in the Foot. The De Banco Roll entries give the names of the parties, but the parcels of the property dealt with, and the nature of the estate created by the Fine (e.g. a conveyance in fee, or a settlement for life with remainders), are not usually recorded. The serial numbers of the Feet are here retained, where the identification seems fairly certain.
