TRIP TO MEXICO, GUATEMALA, & HONDURAS

16 Dec  
16-18 Dec

Left Baltimore at 0750 and flew to San Antonio via Atlanta. Spent weekend in Austin-San Antonio area, and visited with Amy Hiatt, Eve Hiatt, Mike Stevens, Ed Rowan, Larry Jameson, and Beryl Simpson. A good time was had by all.

Notes on vegetation and topography: This region is locally referred to as the "Hill Country"- it is the southern edge of the Edwards Plateau, and features rolling topography with occasional ridges that rise perhaps 1000 ft. above the general landscape. Most exposed rock seems to be a whitish cherty-looking bedded limestone, but we visited one area along the Colorado R. N. of Johnson City that had outcrops of pink, coarse-grained granite (the rock was used to construct the statehouse in Austin).

The area is basically forested, although the forest is of low stature and somewhat scrubby to my eye. Of course, what one sees now may well be 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> growth stands, but I think the canopy of the woods here doesn't even approach the height of deciduous forest in the well-watered eastern deciduous region. The bulk of the trees are live oaks and Red Cedars. Fairly rich grass grows among the trees in a few places,





Trip to Chichen Itza

After breakfast, headed east from Merida on a good paved road toward the Mayan ruins at Chichen Itza. Country is mostly flat to very gently rolling, and has a scrubby aspect. Population density is apparently quite low away from Merida and the larger towns. Limestone underlies the entire Yucatan peninsula, and is used as a major building material. Stone walls very common, and many large churches. Typical dwellings are small whitewashed adobe huts (adobe plastered onto tightly aligned fence-like foundation of sticks) with steeply pitched thatched roof. Very distinctive.

Main crop appears to be sisal; some cornfields & grazing land, but much of the land seems abandoned.








13 Jan

Stopped along the road ~ 20 mi E. of Mérida to watch a medium-sized Bothrops sp. crawling along shoulder of highway. Main birds I noted were Boat-tailed Grackles, Tropical Mockingbird, Social Flycatcher, Black Vulture, Turkey Vulture. Arrived at Chichen Itza about lunchtime, and checked into a small - but very nice neotropical hotel at the w. end of the nearby town of Piste. The big American-type hotels are much more expensive. The people running our hotel were tiny - almost elf-like.

Spent the afternoon at the ruins - very impressive restoration there. Made us wish we'd done more background reading before I came down here. Visited the sacred cenote (sink-hole) near the main pyramid. Spent ~ 1/2 h looking around shaded, mo, st margins for Salamanders (Bolitoglossa yucatana has been taken in the area), but had no success. Saw only a few Anolis - small, slender sp. on ground & rocks. Took lots of pictures. Had dinner at a spectacularly beautiful Hacienda just E. of ruins.

14 Jan

En route Chichen Itza - Isla Mujeres

After a leisurely breakfast we drove ~ 5 km W. of Chichen Itza and turned N. onto dirt road leading to the "Grutas de Balancán". Spectacular limestone cavern w. big chambers used for Mayan ceremonies. Again, plenty

of moist, shady rocky habitat around the mouth of the cave, but no salamanders to be found.

Had lunch in Piste, then continued east into Quintana Roo, passed through Valladolid, and on to the Caribbean Coast. Weather steadily deteriorated, and rain was falling by the time we reached Puerto Morelos, where we caught the ferry to Isla Mujeres. Ride to the island costs 50 pesos/car and 10 pesos/Passenger, and takes about 45 minutes.

Arrived at Isla Mujeres about 1600h and checked in at the "Hotel Berney". Fairly nice, new, moderate hotel downtown. Isla Mujeres itself is a long, skinny island, perhaps 10km x 1 km, with all human settlement concentrated at the north end, mainly on the W. side, facing the mainland. Lots of low-budget tourists here, many of them European. The island has a Navy base and a large fish-packing operation. We were told it is the major fishing port on the Quintana Roo Coast. Very low-key, mellow scene here, and everyone appears to get along well.

North end of island is nice sandy beach, Caribbean-facing W. side is rough, rocky cliffs with a few small beaches. E-facing side has an elongate lagoon, mangrove swamps, sandy beaches, and a spectacular bit


