**TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SALES:**

**CASH DISCOUNT:** For cash before shipment is made we allow a 3% discount. If shipment is to be made C. O. D., we require a deposit of 25% of the amount of the order in advance and allow 2% discount.

**DEFERRED PAYMENT** after 60 days carries 8% interest.

**PRICES:**

Our prices are for No. 1 grade. Customers who are in the market for No. 1½ or No. 2 grade should write us stating their requirements and we will make special quotation.

**CONDITIONS:**

All orders are received subject to cancellation in case of damage to our stock by contingencies beyond our control. Shipments travel at purchaser's risk when properly delivered to carrier. Complaints and claims for shortage, etc., must be made within five days after arrival of goods.

**BOOKING ORDERS FOR FUTURE DELIVERY:**

For customers desiring stock shipped at later dates, we are prepared to hold the goods in good condition up until May 1st, if 50% of the amount is paid with order.
