Cannas are beautiful and can be used with imagination and daring in the summer annual garden as backgrounds for Zinnias, Cosmos and Marigolds. Their stately plant form and vivid colorings are often an important addition to an otherwise timid garden sheme.

Cannas may be planted in any soil but welcome the addition of heary fertilizer. They require full sun and bloom from earls August until late September. The roots are lifted and stored over the winter.

## Giant Flowering Plants

Because of its wide variation in form with blooms resembling the Camellia, Rose, and Carnation, the Tuberous Begonia is often called "The Mocking Bird Flower." Tubers should be started indoors in pots or flats ten weeks before
desired flowering time.
When the weather warms, transfer to the open in a location shielded from the direct rays of the sun. They will bloom continuously from mid-July until frost.

> The flowers bloom in clusters of three, one large male flower in the center with a pair of female flowers on either side. Remove the side flowers to permit the full development of the center flower thus obtaining exhibition blooms measuring up to 6 inches across.

## CARNATION-FLOWERED BEGONIAS

(Fimbriata Plena.) A fully double flower with petals ruffled and fringed at the edges similar to the Carnation. Flowers are a little smaller than the Camellia type but come into bloom earlier. Well suited to outdoor bedding.

HEMEROCALLIS HYBRID DAYLILIES. The new Hybrid Daylilies provide a wealth of uses to the gardener. Choice of variety covers the wide range from the low growing sorts for the small flower beds to the tall majestic ones for the distant view. Colors are from pale yellow, orange, red to deep bronze and purple tones with the rhythm of continual bloom from May until September. All require little care and thrive in that often difficult location of too little sun.
