ECONOMY IN FLOWER PRODUCTION

To overcome the difficulties occasioned by the Government curtailing his coal supply, every florist by sound reasoning must make a quick and decided change in his plans for the coming Winter and Spring. No sane man will allow his houses to run idle, and he knows he cannot produce soft-wooded expensive stock; on the other hand he will choose those plants that can be grown at least cost, requiring less coal, and there is no class that will answer this purpose so

satisfactorily as Hardy Perennials. Take for example Delphiniums, Aquilegias, Canterbury Bells, Shasta Daisies, Pyrethrum, Lupinus Polyphyllus—Here are a few plants, the flowers of which in their ordinary blooming season command a considerable price; would they not be worth much more by wintering them over at the inexpensive temperature of 38 or 40 degrees, and with a little increased heat in the early spring flowered a month or two earlier under glass?

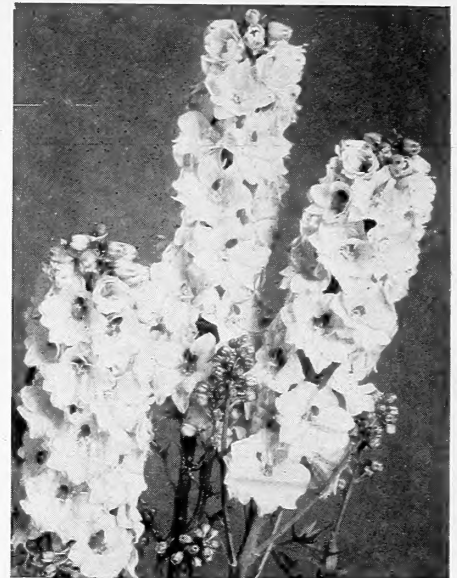

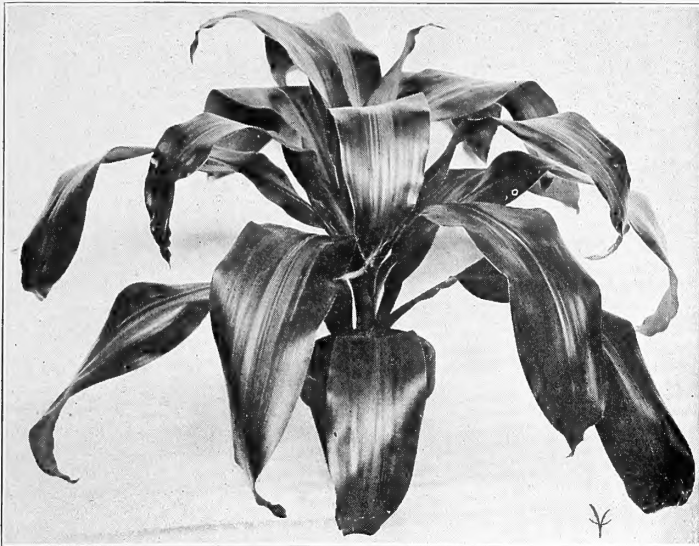
