#### HISTORY



KING ARE THE ONLY OF THESE FIFTY SOME THAT HAVE RE= MAINED WITH US THESE TWELVE YEARS.

WITH ALL OUR EARACHES, TOOTHACHES, AND TROUBLES, WE PROUDLY ENTERED THE SECOND GRADE. MISS ALMENA GRAHAM, WITH HER KINDNESS AND PATIENCE, SENT US ON OUR JOURNEY TO THE THIRD GRADE, WHERE MISS ALEXANDER REIGNED SUPREME. IT WAS DURING THIS YEAR THAT VELMA PANKEY JOINED OUR CLASS.

MISS GRIFFIN RULED OVER THE FOURTH GRADE WITH A LONG WIDE PADDLE. BUT STILL, UNDER THESE CIRCUMSTANCES, WE COULD NOT HELP BUT LIKE HER. WITH A SIGH OF RELIEF, SHE PUSHED US TOWARD MISS BLAKELY, WHO KEPT US IN ORDER THROUGHOUT OUR FIFTH YEAR IN SCHOOL, (AND I DO MEAN IN ORDER.) OUR SIXTH YEAR PASSED RAPIDLY WITH MISS MCFAYDEN IN THE DRIVER'S SEAT.

ALL DURING THIS SUMMER WE WONDERED WHO OUR SEVENTH GRADE TEACHER WOULD BE. THE FIRST DAY OF THE NEXT YEAR, WE FOUND, TO OUR SUR-PRISE, A FAMILIAR FACE, BUT A NEW NAME. IT WAS OUR SECOND GRADE TEACHER AGAIN WHO HAD THEN CHANGED HER NAME TO MRS. ROBERT MCLEOD. MRS. MCLEOD SENT US ON OUR JOURNEY TO THE EIGHTH GRADE WHERE MRS. ROBERT (PADDLE AND ALL) TOMLINSON PREPARED US FOR HIGH SCHOOL. TO RELATE IN DETAIL THE HISTORY OF THE CLASS OF 1949 WOULD BE TO WRITE A LONG, LONG BOOK.

INDEED OUR CAREER THROUGH HIGH SCHOOL HAS BEEN MARKED BY VARIOUS ACCOMPLISHMENTS AND ACHIEVEMENTS, VARIOUS FAILURES AND DEFEATS. BUT THROUGH IT ALL WE CAME, SMILING AT THE THOUGHTS OF OUR SUCCESS, SAD AT THE THOUGHT OF FAREWELL.

IN THE FALL OF 1945 A HAPPY-GO-LUCKY-BAND OF "NON-VERDANT" (AS WE SUPPOSED) BOYS AND GIRLS ENTERED BISCOE HIGH SCHOOL. WE WERE GUIDED THROUGH OUR STRUGGLES OF FRESHMAN LIFE BY MISS WINIFRED DOISER, MISS BUENA BALDWIN, MRS. JAMES TURNER, MR. J.E. SWITZER, AND MR. A. S. HUNT, OUR PRINCIPAL. OUR FIRST YEAR OF ... HIGH SCHOOL WAS ONE OF KEENEST PLEASURE AND JOY. SO RAPT WERE WE IN THE THRILL OF BEING IN HIGH SCHOOL THAT NO IDEA OF BEING "GREEN " FLASHED IN OUR MINDS. NEVERTHELESS, AS THE YEAR NEARED ITS CLOSE, EVERY FRESHIE WAS JOY-OYSLY AWAITING HIS SOPHOMORE RANKING. OUR CLASS WAS MADE COMPLETE THIS YEAR WHEN LEWIS TRENT, J. M. DYSON AND DONALD BAILEY JOINED US.

IN THE FALL OF 1946 WE HAPPILY ENTERED OUR SOPHOMORE YEAR. OUR CLASS WAS INDEED AN EX-CEPTION, FOR IT BORE OUT THE TRADITIONAL MEANING OF THE WORD SOPHOMORE. OUR INSTRUCT-ORS FOR THIS YEAR WERE MRS. CONNOR, MR. MAT-THEWS, MR. C.H. WEATHERLY, AND MRS. TURNER. THIS YEAR OUR PRINCIPAL WAS MR. C.H. WEATHER-LY. WE TOOK A LIKING TO HIM JUST AS WE HAD MR. HUNT. SOON THE YEAR WAS OVER AND WE THEN CLIMBED TO THE THIRD RUNG OF OUR HIGH SCHOOL LADDER.

OUR JUNIOR YEAR WE HAD ANOTHER CHANGE OF PRINCIPALS, MR. WEATHERLY WAS REPLACED BY MR. G.B. LAMM. ONE NOTABLE EVENT OF THIS YEARS ACTIVITIES, AND ONE WHICH IS A PLEASANT MEM-ORY, WAS THE JUNIOR-SENIOR BANQUET, GIVEN MARCH 26 IN THE LUNCH ROOM. UNDER THE LEAD-ERSHIP OF MRS. KISSEL, WE GAVE A VERY BEAUTI-FUL BANQUET WITH THE THEME OF "CARNIVAL OF LIFE." ACTIVITIES OF EVERY SORT CROWDED THIS

YEAR, AND IT SPED BY ALL TOO SWIFTLY. FINALLY CAME THAT DAY OF DAYS ON WHICH WE WERE OFFICIALLY CALLED SENIORS. THIS YEAR OUR SPONSOR WAS MRS. CONNOR. THIS YEAR EVERY ACTIVITY IN WHICH SENIORS HAVE BEEN PROMINENT SEEMED TO BLOSSOM FORTH AND TO BE REALLY WORTHWHILE. ONE EVENT THAT WILL ALWAYS BE A CHERISHED MEMORY IN OUR HEARTS WILL BE OUR SENIOR PLAY "SILAS SMIDGE FROM TURNIP RIDGE", WHICH WAS GIVEN ON MARCH 4. EVEN A GREATER THRILL WAS EXPERIENCED WHEN WE WERE CALLED UPON TO GIVE THE PLAY THE SECOND TIME BY POP-ULAR DEMAND. THE SENIORS REIGNED SUPREME ON MARCH 31, WHEN WE CELEBRATED SENIOR PRIVILEGE DAY .


# BISCOE BULLDOGS BUILD FOR NEXT SEASON






