
HISTORY

WITH ALL OUR EARACHES, TOOTHACHES, AND TROUBLES, WE PROUDLY ENTERED THE SECOND GRADE. MISS ALMENA GRAHAM, WITH HER KINDNESS AND PATIENCE, SENT US ON OUR JOURNEY TO THE THIRD GRADE, WHERE MISS ALEXANDER REIGNED SUPREME. IT WAS DURING THIS YEAR THAT VELMA PANKEY JOINED OUR CLASS.



WE WERE GUIDED THROUGH OUR STRUGGLES OF FRESHMAN LIFE BY MISS WINIFRED DOISER, MISS BUENA BALDWIN, MRS. JAMES TURNER, MR. J.E. SWITZER, AND MR. A. S. HUNT, OUR PRINCIPAL. OUR FIRST YEAR OF HIGH SCHOOL WAS ONE OF KEENEST PLEASURE AND JOY. SO RAPT WERE WE IN THE THRILL OF BEING IN HIGH SCHOOL THAT NO IDEA OF BEING "GREEN" FLASHED IN OUR MINDS.
