We, the Class of 1942, stepped upon the deck of the big steamer, <u>High School</u>, in 1938. Just a few more years, and our voyage would be only a glimmer of history.

The sailing was tough the first year, but under the guidance of our captain, Miss Marie Ropp, most of us managed to pull through. Then we reached --- ---

September, 1939, which found most of the members of the class still sailing. The going was easier this year. The crew had become used to the storms and tides, such as math and science, and knew how to battle them until they were conquered. The climax of the year was when the gang got together with their new captain, Mr. E. F. Brooks, and had a weigner roast. The year seemed to fly by and before we knew it arother year was upon us.

In September, 1940, feeling very proud of curselves, we took our positions as junior seamen. This year we had to assume more responsibility. We elected the following class officers: president, Martha Jefferson: vice-president, Lymon Gay; secretary-treasurer, Janie Holland. Our Captain this year was Mr. H. V. Parker. One of the outstanding events of the year was the Junior-Senior Banquet when we invited the senior seamen to gather with us as our guests.

In the fall of 1941, we had reached the goal for which we had been striving for three years. The sailing was still tough; but our new commander, Miss Poxie Worthington, managed to guide us into calmer waters. Class officers for the year were: president, Janie Holland; vice-president, Lillian little; secretary-treasurer, Guy Eagles.

The time which climated all else was the night of May 1, 1942, when twelve happy seniors were given diplomas as full-flegded seamen and stepped from the deck of <u>High School</u> upon the platform of life to take their places in the world.




We extend our thanks to the members of the Board of Trustees as well as our parents for the privileges enjoyed here. Your influence has laid the foundation for this hour.
