

A WORD TO NEW CORRESPONDENTS.

To you who are in want of the kinds of stock I have to offer, but are afraid to order because you are unacquainted with my mode of dealing, I invite your attention to the following

HISTORY IN BRIEF.

Fifty years ago, there were only two Nurseries in this country, and they conducted on a very small scale. About that time, my grandfather commenced the transplanting of Evergreens from his own pasture in Maine, to Massachusetts. He was succeeded in business by my father, who, for a period of over thirty years, sold, in the vicinity of Quincy Market, Boston, during the planting season, "Pasture-Grown Trees."

My first recollections of work are connected with collecting small Evergreens for shipment. Eleven consecutive Springs, I have been in this city, during which time I have disposed of over 5,000,000 plants from the pastures of Maine. One of my chief aims has been, to furnish stock useful to the purchaser, as well as profitable to the seller; and, from the constant increase of customers from every section of the country, I can truly say that my labors are appreciated. From my many years of practical experience in business, extensive travels and observations among the tree-planters, I unhesitatingly assert this fact: Stock procured through me succeeds better than that procured through other sources, for these

1st. I collect plants with constitutions, and of size and strength sufficient to overcome the necessary exposure in transplanting.

2d. I do not expose plants to sun and drying winds, while collecting or afterwards, sufficiently long to destroy their vitality.

3d. Plants from the State of Maine are hardier than any others, and can be shipped with safety till 10th of June, usually.

PRIVATE NURSERIES.

Try it, and thereby lay the foundation to a monument that will rear itself to perpetuate your name for ages yet to come.
