Also all other desirable Bulbs, Tubers and Bedding-out Plants at usual rates. When ten or more plants are ordered, they may be had in different varieties at the price per ten, in quantities of not less than five of each kind: and when one hundred or more are ordered, at the price per hundred, for quantities not less than twenty-five of each variety. No charge for packing or delivery at Express Office. Clubs and large purchasers will be liberally dealt with.
