Dear Sir -



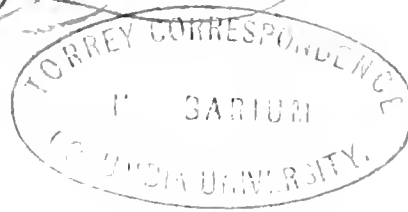
