



CLASS HISTORY

In September of 1947 there arrived on the campus of Johnson C. Smith University the members of what proved to be the most energetic, versatile and industrious class in the history of the University. Green days were hard days in development and by the wayside but they left a record none clearer together and at the end of the first semester this class was found rushing eagerly toasted for the next lap of the long race to education land. Joyce Venable and George Flanigan won the outstanding scholarship awards given by Kappa Alpha Psi for having the best scholastic records for the semester in the class. Of course it was acknowledged too that a greater number of Freshmen had made honor roll averages and averages above 1.5 than in many a freshman class. Early in its life as a class this group of students coming from as far south as B. W. I. and as far north as Boston, had shown their wares and won approval and awe. All were still talking about the great talent shown at the Freshman Frolic, where Paul Johnson and Maggie Lynch filled the crowd. Many were heard to remark, "Why these dogs conduct themselves like upperclassmen already." On the athletic field and hardwood floor, in the classroom and in every phase of campus life the freshmen were outstanding. At the end of the first semester we were organized with George Flanigan as president and then we did go places. Why every task undertaken by the class was a roaring success. The next year found our ranks still smaller by number but stronger in unity and we marched off with the coveted cup for making the greatest contribution to the Negro College Fund campaign. Now when we gave our great Sophomore Ball that was when we broke all records. Why the social life of the class was nonstop but the class was well acknowledged by all as the best planned, most beautiful and orderly dance given on the campus in history. Even Dean Grimes thought Smith was another mirage when he was greeted at the door and ushered into the lovely setting where soft music played. Why, even Buddy Pickett made the ladies dressing room in pink and white. During the year Dot Brice and Fay Cunningham were awarded cups as tokens for their outstanding contributions to student life and activities. All sophomore men won letters for their achievements in athletics. Flap Flanigan was our president again and in September, 1949, when we came back for our Junior year there wasn't a single organiza-

tion or activity carried on that did not feel the influence directly or indirectly of the class of 51. During the year a number of students joined us in their home societies and, of course, the Junior class led with number of members. Outstanding scholarship and community responsibility was the theme of all class activity as we organized with Alex Byers as president. Under the guidance of the dance chairman, Paul Johnson, the class started collecting its funds for the Junior-Senior Prom at the beginning of the year and this foresightedness paid off but good. The class of 51 gave the grandest Junior-Senior Prom in the history of Smith. Like little soldiers, male and female members of the class scrubbed and waxed the gym from top to bottom and for weeks the girls' dormitories had been humming with the sound of favors and decorations being made. The great night arrived and the campus was spellbound at what they saw in Harry Woods gym. Class members attended many national and international conferences and served as spark plugs to many worthwhile delegations, with skill and dignity. Under the presidency of our calm and able leader, Alex Byers, we came back to Smith the September of 1950, a more dignified and thoughtful class. Many of our classmates had been called to active duty in military service and all young men were expecting to be called at any moment but oh happy day, the letters of postponement began to come through and the boys could be here until graduation. Now to settle down to hard study and enjoyment of our last year as students at dear Ole J.C.S.U. Practice teaching separated us for a short time but we came back with a renewed sense of responsibility and with eyes turned wide to the job ahead. Why it's graduation time and it seems like yesterday that we came wide eyed and green. Why, we are leaving the old Alma Mater for grad-schools, jobs and military posts. No matter how far one may roam there is one thing that will always take him back to places and faces so dear, and that is memories. This class is rich with memories and so as a group we are wealthy. Farewell for awhile Johnson C. Smith University, but the class of 51 will live on united forever whether we are together physically or not.




