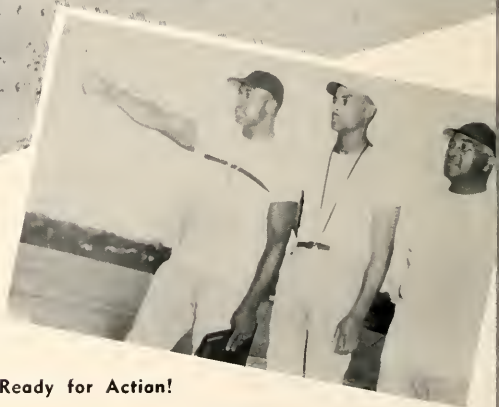
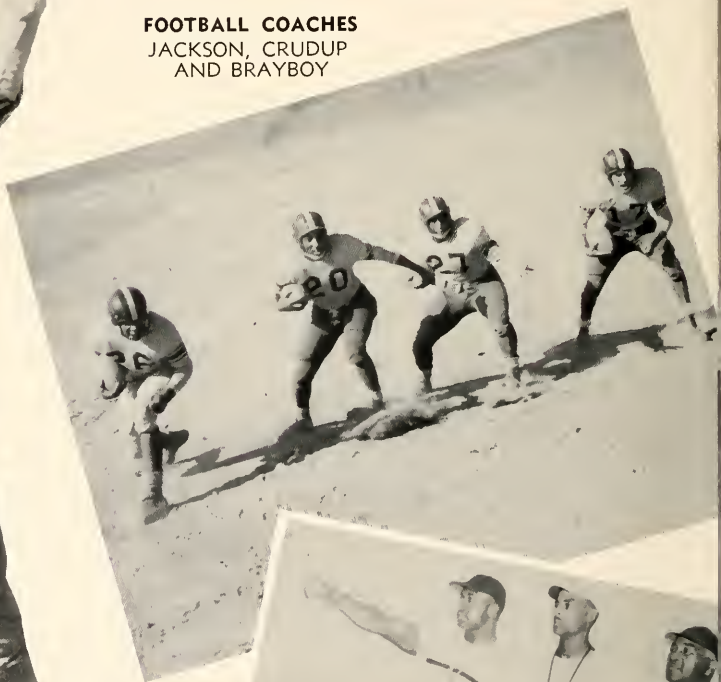
Although Smith did not enjoy a winning season, the players profited greatly by his experience. Each member of the team did his utmost to uphold the Gold and Blue of which we are all proud.
