

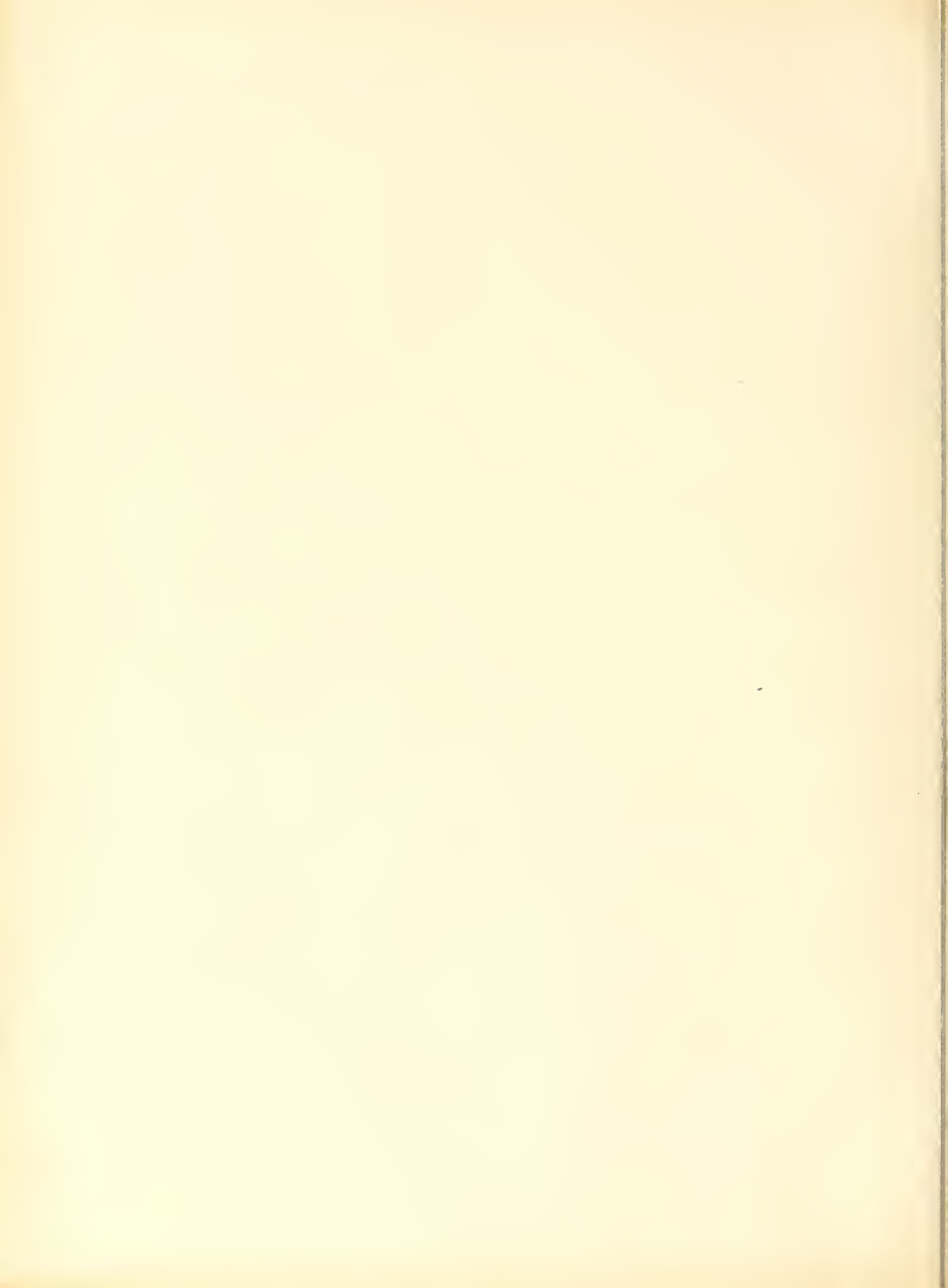

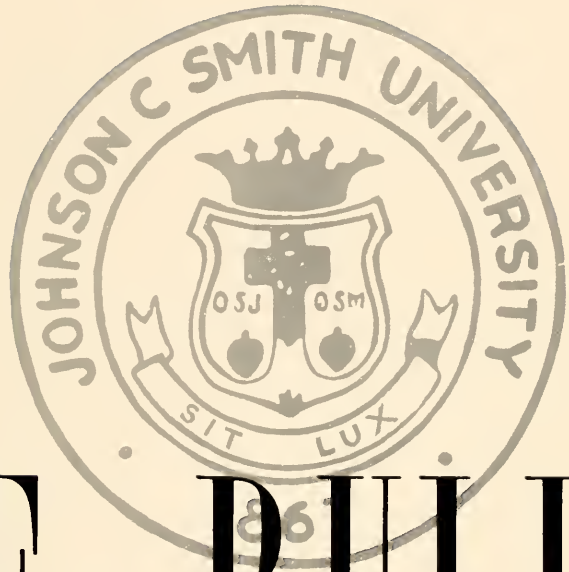
Following the paths winding across

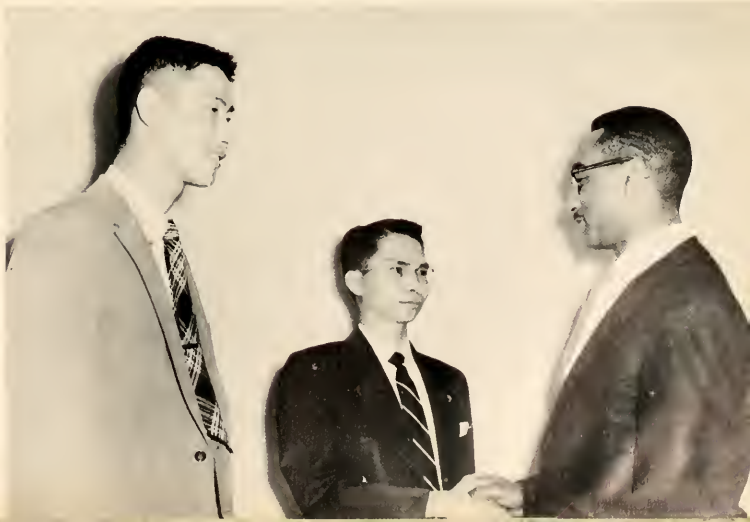
