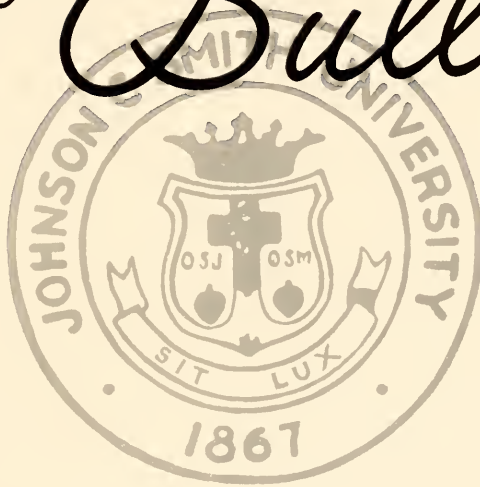

## Foreword

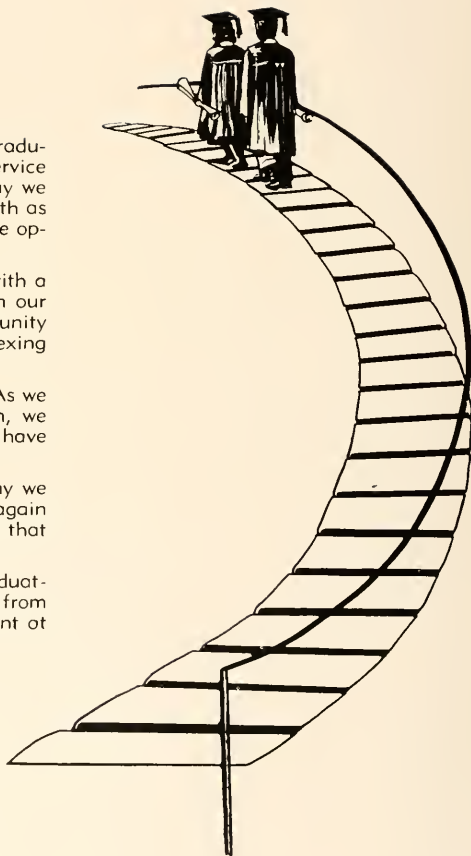
