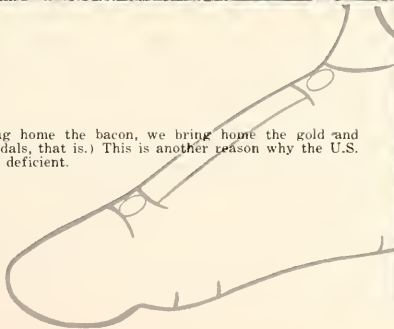

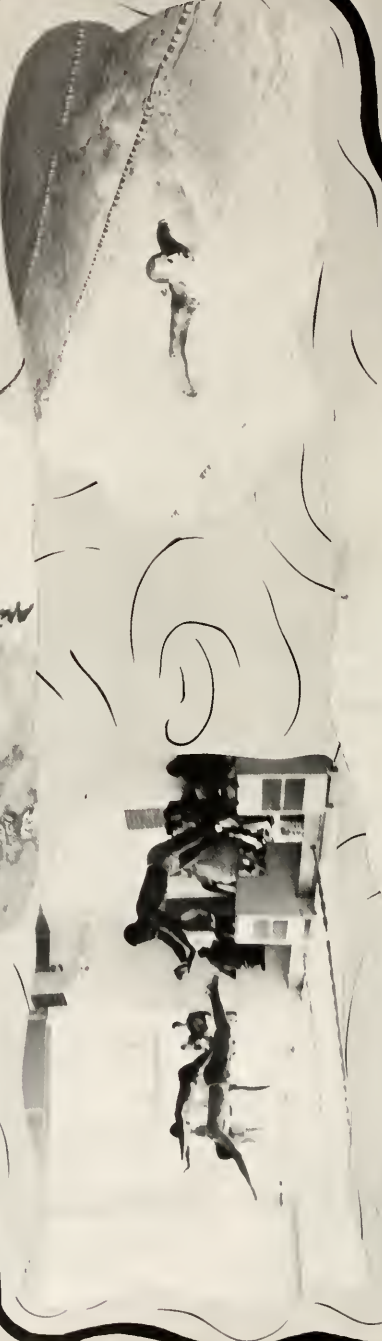

To all these we express sincere gratitude in helping us complete what we hope you consider "a job well done."

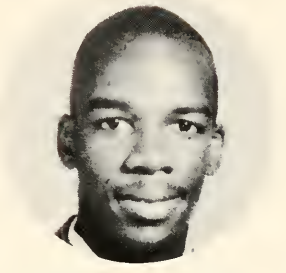
